'They pull the nose up and try to turn the plane, and that will cause an even more violent sensation in the pilot," he said. "So, the tendency would be to return to what didn't feel as

Lessard said returning the plane to deep descent will cause the plane to go in to what is called a graveyard spiral.

"It is called a graveyard spiral for a very good reason — a lot of pilots don't get out of it alive," Lessard said. "Eventually, the plane will be straight down and traveling too fast for a pilot

To counteract this problem, a new instrument has been developed called the Advanced Spatial Disorientation Demonstrator (ASDD).

Pilots work with this instrument to help simulate environments which would create conditions similar to that which would cause spatial disorienta-




