"The turnout was good, but we wanted more people to come out and get to know the people of different cultures," Yeh said. "This is a good start for a new tradition, here at A&M."

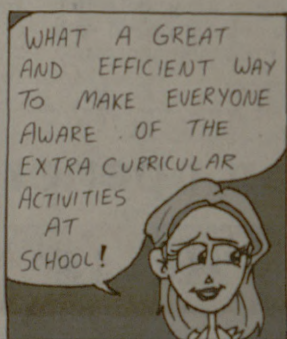

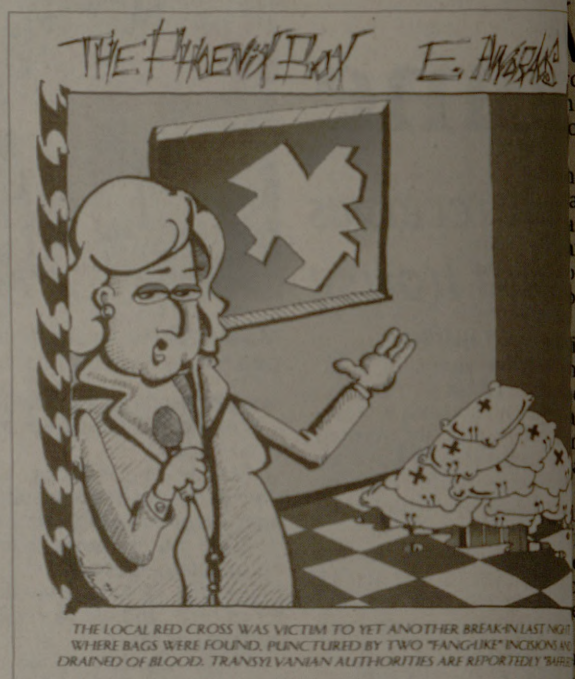
