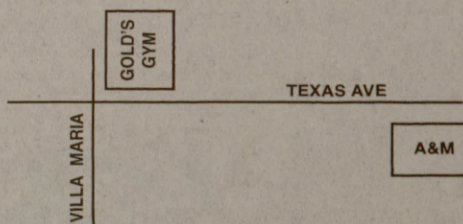
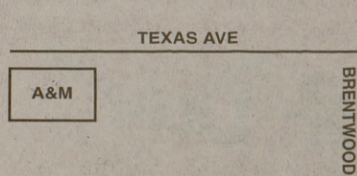

### The Hippos

The Hippos introduce their zany and slightly distressful tunes in their new CD, *Heads Are Gonna Roll*.

Instructions labeled on the CD tell listeners to play the album at "maximum volume."

After sifting through selections of songs like "Lost It," "Wasting My Life," "Struggling" and "Far Behind," it would probably be proper to leave instructions like "listen with a large box of kleenex and a bottle of aspirin."

The band's most credible attempt for eager listeners would be their remake of "Always Something There to Remind Me," which becomes a diamond for the CD as a memorable '80s rebirth.

Ariel Rechtshald puts in a pleasing performance as lead vocalist. He is accompanied by band

members representing a wide variety of instruments ranging from old-school brass to synthesizers.

Unfortunately, the lyrics are lost underneath an umbrella of more than 10 different instruments. Someone should tell this band "less is more."

Overall, *Heads Are Gonna Roll* sounds like ska-pop, adding a hint of big band swing.

This combination, already popular among listeners, should garner fans for the hip Hippos. (Grade: B+)

Former Nine Inch Nails guitarist Richard Patrick has finally released the follow-up album to *Short Bus*, Filter's first album which con-

tained only one hit single, "Man Nice Shot."

The new album continues the same tradition as the last with plenty of blaring guitars, screaming and drum mad-

But as always, a few songs highlight the softer side of the band with calm melodies and acoustic guitar.

This album crunches hard rock but is still repetitive and leans on Patrick's scratchy voice becomes very irritating after or five songs.

The slower songs offer the album like "I'm Not the One" and "Miss Blue" are not followed by the mundane of most slower songs offer harder rock albums.

The first single, "Welcome the Fold" is a catchy hard-rock tune but suffers from corny lyrics, a trend throughout the album. Is it not cool for rock to write sensible lyrics?

On the whole, however, *Record* is a toe-tapping, keeping hard rock album chock-full of angst-goodness.

But in the post-alternative rock era, Filter seems a little out of place.

With bands like Korn, Limp Bizkit, Nine Inch Nails and Hot Chili Peppers setting trends in music, Filter needs to evaluate its effort. (Grade: C+)

## Using the World Wide Web for Research

Texas A&M University General Libraries is offering a class to assist Texas A&M University students and faculty in effectively using the World Wide Web for research.

This session uses Netscape Navigator or Internet Explorer to search the World Wide Web. It surveys WWW search services, illustrates advanced search strategies, teaches how to store sites useful for your class work of research and provides criteria for evaluating and citing web information. Sessions include demonstration and hands-on practice. Bring a 3.5 formatted high density disk if you want to save information.

Prerequisite: This class meets for an hour and 15 minutes in a CIS Open Access Computing Lab. You must CLAIM A LABS ACCOUNT from the Block ATM screen or a CIS help desk (call 845-8300 for assistance) prior to the class in order to use a computer in an Open Access Computing Lab.
