Ariel Rechtshald puts in a pleasing performance as lead vocalist. He is accompanied by band

members representing a wide variety of instruments ranging from old-school brass to synthesizers

Unfortunately, the lyrics are lost underneath an umbrella of more than 10 different instruments. Someone should tell this band 'less is more.

Overall, Heads Are Gonna Roll sounds like ska-pop, adding a hint of big band swing.

This combination, already popular among listeners, should gar ner fans for the hip Hippos. (Grade: B+)
