## Mother Dearest

### Aggie Moms provide students with support

For students and parents who need help adjusting to college, there is an organization not found among the hundreds of organizations at the MSC Open House that may help.

Many people do not realize the Aggie Moms' Clubs do more than just hand out care baskets to students during finals.

Laura Johnson, a junior political science major, said Aggie Moms' give students a sense of security. "I think everything Aggie Moms' do is cool," Johnson said. "When they come and bring gift baskets, it

is fun to meet other people's moms from your own hometown. The fact that moms are visible lets you know someone is there in case something goes wrong."

Debbie McKinley, a member of the Tyler Aggie Moms' club, said there also is an Adopt an Aggie program for Aggies whose families live too far away.

"Last year a Russian mom whose son was a freshman in the Corps of Cadets called us, and we set up a family for him from the Brazos County Club," McKinley said.

Among other duties of the more than 125 Aggie Moms' Clubs, which span numerous states, is financial support of stu-

dents and the organization are involved in.

Karen Taylor, a member of the Tyler Aggie Moms' Club, said clubs help to support the financially if they need it.

"Our mission is to provide scholarships and donations," Taylor said.

Through fund raises, Aggie Moms provide scholarships for students who attend A&M for at least one year.

Taylor said Aggie Moms are a form of support for students with empty-nest syndrome.

"Both of my sons left the same time to go to college, went to A&M and one went to Texas Tech University," Taylor said. "Aggie Moms are a place to get answers about your children can go to campus when they need help with questions such as where to live and in a different city."

McKinley said Aggie Moms follow the same credo as the A&M do.

"Once an Aggie mom, an Aggie mom," McKinley said. "Dads can be associated with us. We don't want them to be and feel like they are just paying for everything."

Billie Jean Harper, president of the Tyler Aggie Moms' Club, said many mothers are still active in the organization even though their children have graduated.

"My son is already married and has a job in the oil industry and we still enjoy being active," Harper said. "I founded the Aggie Moms' Club of my son. He encourages me to join, and for that reason I am dedicated to him."

McKinley said besides monthly meetings, Aggie Moms also provide programs for parents the opportunity for students have to get involved in University.

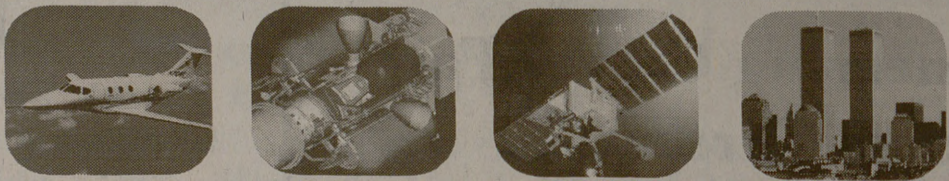
