

# No. 17 Ags buck the Bronco

The Texas A&M Volleyball Team's attack was in full effect at G. Rollie White Coliseum last night as the Aggies swept Santa Clara University, 15-10, 15-5, 16-14. The Aggies have swept their last six opponents en route to a seven-game winning streak.

A&M jumped out to a quick 5-0 lead in game one before the first timeout was called by the Broncos. But an ace by senior middle blocker Amber Woolsey put the Aggies up 12-5 before the Broncos went on a 4-0 run.

The Aggies regained their composure, though, and a kill by Woolsey ended game one. The Aggies dominated on the net with three kills from senior outside hitter Summer Strickland.

Game two found the Aggies trading points with the Broncos until two monster blocks by Strickland and senior middle blocker Laurie Leahy put the Aggies up 6-4.

Strickland and Leahy teamed up again for their third block of the game to force a Bronco timeout with the Aggies leading 8-5. A&M never looked back as kills from senior outside hitter Celia Howes and Leahy led the Aggies to a game two victory.

The Aggies started game three

with two back-to-back blocks by Woolsey and Strickland, but three consecutive kills by the Broncos gave Santa Clara its first lead of the match, 4-3. The Aggies regained the lead and kills by Howes and Strickland put them up 10-6. But the Broncos continued to fight, and tied the score at 13.

A&M coach Laurie Corbelli called a timeout, but the Broncos managed to score game point. The Aggies never let up, though, and a block by Leahy and sophomore outside hitter Michelle Cole ended the game and the match.

"Their coaches made defensive adjustments to us that made it more difficult to ball away," Corbelli said. "Our hitters had to rethink what we were doing and where they were tacking."

Overall, the Aggies posted a .343 hitting percentage. Howes posted a team high of 19 kills.

The Aggies will be in action today at 1 p.m. against the University of Georgia and the University of Georgia respectively.
