applies to current employees who change jobs and move to different departments or offices within the University.

Before someone is eligible for payroll, prospective employees affected by the law must present their Selective Service registration card, Potts said, or the University can contact the Selective Service database to confirm an employee's status.

A certificate of mailing can be ob-

tained from the Post Office and will be used as proof of application until an employee receives his registration card.

Michele Henley, the coordinator for student employment at the Student Financial Aid, said federal law already requires Selective Service registration in order to receive financial aid for college. Henley said there are over 13,400 student workers at Texas A&M including about 1,000 students in college work-study, but is unclear how many will be directly affected by the new policy.

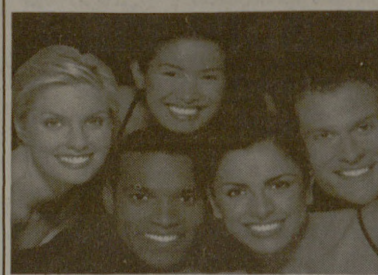
