Earthquake toll reaches 2,000

Rescue workers search for cries beneath rubble of buried

TAIPEI, Taiwan (AP) — As cries for help increasingly turned to ominous silence, rescue teams battled the clock yesterday to save nearly 2,000 trapped and missing victims of Taiwan's devastating earthquake.

More than 60 hours after the earthquake struck, at least 2,103 people were known dead, 7,800 injured and 1,844 still unaccounted for — the vast majority of whom were believed buried under rubble and landslides, the Disaster Management Center said.

The center said 2,268 people had been rescued, many of them extracted from some 6,000 completely destroyed housing units across the island.

Local newspapers said several hundred thousand people were homeless but this could not be officially confirmed.

The Tuesday temblor had a preliminary magnitude of 7.6 — about the same strength as the devastating tremor that killed more than 15,000 people in Turkey last month.

Although many people were still trapped in buildings, Wednesday's rescue efforts yielded only nine who were safely brought out, officials said.

And in some isolated, mountain villages of central Taiwan, the worst-hit region of the island, rescue efforts have just begun.

Rescuers had to walk for hours through rugged terrain Wednesday to reach the village of Kuoshin, where a massive flow of mud and rock off three hillsides killed 60 villagers and buried 40 others, the *China Times* reported.

Only 50 people, a third of the population, are known to have survived as the hills virtually collapsed and filled up a valley, the newspaper said.

One mother, identified as Mrs. Chang, said she and her two daughters were carried along on the slide for a half-mile "as if sitting on a magic carpet."

The village is located in Nantou County, where 830 people were killed, while more than 970 died in neighboring Taichung County.

These two hardest-hit counties are to receive the bulk of \$90 million the government said it has allocated for immediate disaster relief.

The Taiwanese government said it will spend \$32 million to build 2,000 temporary homes to shelter homeless earthquake victims — with an ambitious deadline of three



weeks to get the job done. Many people have not enough was done trapped relatives. Some people have been wrecked buildings, listening to cries from trapped family.

Peacekeepers face gun fire in East Timor

DILI, East Timor (AP) — Gunfire rattled across the ravaged city of Dili yesterday, sending international peacekeepers nervously chasing gunmen they believed were hostile militiamen or undisciplined Indonesian soldiers.

No contact was made, and no one was hurt. But a series of shooting incidents — the first since the multinational force arrived Monday — and reports of militias gathering in West Timor raised tensions and dissipated the peacekeepers' warm welcome.

Maj. Gen. Peter Cosgrove, commander of the peacekeeping force, warned that his men would shoot to kill if they ran into more armed challenges to the foreigners' authority.

A British officer said Indonesian soldiers on trucks opened fire.

"They were firing to see what our response drills are like," Brig. David Richards, commander of the British contingent, said. "They are probing our responses. It is a test."

"There are those who are trying to create confusion in the minds of everyone that things are not under control of Dili's chaotic capital has passed to the Indonesian army to the Australian-led multinational force, Richards said.

Witnesses reported several shooting incidents. Richards indicated the bursts of automatic weapons came from three truckloads of soldiers passing through the British-controlled sector to the Australian zone.

There was great confusion on the ground about whether the firing was hostile and directed against international force.

Civilians scurried for cover. Troops moved cautiously through the city, crouching in combat formations and firing through littered back alleys and courtyards, roughly searching anyone they found for weapons.

"Most of those shots, I'm pleased to say, were aimed, but of course it's hard to say whether they're by you," Cosgrove told Australian television.
