Researchers use particles in sun stu

A team of physics professors at Texas A&M have developed a new way to catch a scientific sneak-peek into the inner workings of the sun, which may shed some light on the mystery of how the universe is put together.

The team discovered a way to determine the rate at which subatomic particles, called neutrinos, are emitted by the sun's nuclear-fusion process.

Team member Dr. Robert Tribble said the new process finds the probability of the reaction when neutrinos are produced. The prior method which attempted to recreate the reaction itself often produced unreliable results that could vary as much as 30 percent, Tribble said.
