members are no longer directly obligated to regulate the consumption of alcohol of those attending.

Meriwether said the change has not affected fraternity's ability to have a good time.

"It was the safe, responsible thing to do," Meriwether said. "It wasn't even hurting our social functions. We're still having a great time."

Meriwether said although there is still opposition to the idea of "going-dry" in some fraternities, Phi Delta Theta is not the only fraternity headed for mandatory regulation. He said the Sigma Nu national council already made the resolution to become alcohol free, but the chapter has not "gone dry" yet.

He said they have until next year to become an alcohol-free house.

Blackwell said more fraternities will become alcohol-free in the future.

"I think we're probably going to see more fraternities at the international level make the decision to be alcohol-free," he said. "The Phi Delta Theta chapter and other chapters that take on this style of living beforehand are going to be in a much better position to see it work."

Fitzwater said he began a relationship with Mikhail Gorbachev, one-time president of the former Soviet Union, through summit meetings in 1987.

"I believe Gorbachev is one of the greatest and most courageous leaders of all time," he said.

He said it is impossible to comprehend the impact Gorbachev had on the Soviet Union when he denounced communism.

He said the way the media is digging to find out about presidential candidate George W. Bush's past is to be expected.

"We can't expect the media to not ask questions and we can't censor the media's questions, but you can censor how you answer the questions," he said.

"In 1992, [when President Clinton was elected] the American people said they don't care about infidelities; they only care if he's a good leader."

Fitzwater said new technology, such as satellites and computers, have changed journalism by intro-

ducing the 24-hour news cycle.

"This was seen in the Gulf War, some in the son case and in the Moskny situation," he said.

Fitzwater said technology, editing, live television and competitive pressure analysts. He said it's an amount of oversight and of journalism diminishes.

"A live camera can't lie," he said. "There's a process at all. A real source can out-wit media to manipulate them."
