

Harvard embarrassed by archive acquisition

CAMBRIDGE, Mass. (AP) — Harvard University has been one-upped by Stanford University in an embarrassing episode involving documents from the Communist Party archives in the former Soviet Union. Harvard on Tuesday issued a news release calling the documents it had just obtained "previously classified," but *The Boston Globe* reported yesterday that the 25 million sheets of material are copies. The Stanford-affiliated Hoover Institution of War, Revolution and Peace has had most of the material for the past five years. "We have more than them," Lora Sorota, a Hoover archivist, said. When told the Hoover Institute has had the archival material for years, Marshall Goldman, associate director of Harvard's David Center for Russian Studies, said: "Oh, brother. That's embarrassing." The Harvard collection was named in honor of George and Abby O'Neill, who donated \$600,000 to acquire the material.

Calvin Klein goes on sale

NEW YORK (AP) — Calvin Klein, the edgy American designer known for racy ads and \$70 jeans, is looking for a buyer or partner for his New York-based fashion company. After watching this year's bidding wars over Gucci, Fendi and other designers, Calvin Klein decided to steal some of the spotlight and hired an investment bank to line up a deal. Klein wants to expand his \$2.5 billion empire into accessories, beauty products, men's wear, active sportswear and home furnishings. The privately owned company also wants to open more retail stores — a move that will relax the grip department stores

'Evolution' removed from guidelines

FRANKFORT, Ky. (AP) — The word "evolution" has quietly been deleted from Kentucky's guidelines for what students should be taught, two months after Kansas created a furor when it dropped Darwin's theory as a required part of the curriculum. The Kentucky Education Department edited out "evolution" and replaced it with the phrase "change over time." Deputy Education Commissioner Gene Wilhoit said the word was considered "a lightning rod that creates a diversion from what we're teaching." Some teachers, already nervous about what they consider an assault on a cornerstone of biology from those who favor the biblical account of creation, were annoyed. "They chose the less scientifically correct term and went with a more politically feasible term," Ken Rosenbaum, director of the Kentucky Science Teachers Association, said yesterday. "In science we have big words like

photosynthesis. Do we not call it photosynthesis? Do we call it plant food making?" Helen Mountjoy, chairperson of the Kentucky Board of Education, said the change would make no difference in the classroom. "We teach evolution and we test evolution in Kentucky." — Helen Mountjoy, Kentucky Board of Education chair

theory that humans descended from apes and other lower species. In many states, including Kentucky, there are periodic attempts at local levels to push "creationism" as a biblical counterbalance to evolution. In 1996, officials in the Marshall County school district in western Kentucky confiscated science textbooks and glued together two pages dealing with the big-bang theory. Some principals had complained that the fifth- and sixth-grade textbooks did not include the biblical account of creation. When the Kentucky science guidelines were first provided to teachers in 1995, they did not include the word "evolution" in the statement: "Biological change over time accounts for the diversity of species developed through gradual processes over many generations." Last year, science teachers successfully campaigned to substitute "evolution" for "change over time."
