garage electronically and visually. "PTTS is generating numbers by visually counting and by means of electronically counting the number of cars in the garage," he said. "PTTS has graphs and data showing that at any point and time, the use of the garage is not at its maximum point. The Southside Garage is at 91.5 percent efficiency."

Frank Shields, a member of Company K-1 and a junior engineering technology major, said he has a garage spot and is concerned about the change.

"I've heard that there might be an increase in rates for a parking garage spot," he said. "I don't know all the facts, but I feel the way the garage spaces are facilitated is fine the way it is now."

Shields said the meeting will better inform him whether to keep his Southside Garage spot. He said he might purchase a red tag to park in a parking lot instead of spending

more money for a green tag. The garage is not numbered.

Heather Wilde, a major resident adviser and a secondary education major, said residents are worried.

"The main complaint from Moshers residents is that students purchase parking spots because they do not search for somewhere to park on campus, for example, blue lots, and now they are of turning the garage to a parking lot, which will lead to more parking spaces," she said.

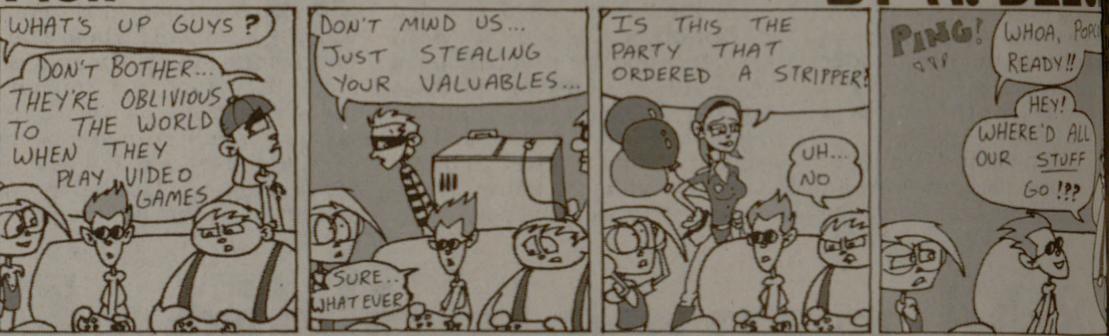
Strickland said the matter at the meeting will go through several progressive steps of implementation.
