Program aims to assist students' housing search

Students will now have help in the search for housing or roommates with Aggie Search, a new off-campus housing database available through Adult, Graduate and Off-Campus Student Services. The service is for students looking for apartments, roommates or who wish to post themselves as potential roommates on a Website.

Jennifer McCreary, assistant coordinator of Off Campus Student Services, said the project has been in the works for 18 months.

"Now that the database is available, students can find housing or roommates at any time," she said.

Students can log on to the Web site to find roommates or housing options in the Bryan-College Station area. Some factors used to narrow the housing search include square footage, rent per month and amenities.

Links to apartment properties

and their Websites also are available through Aggie Search.

McCreary said the Website should help students find housing or roommates who fit with their daily routines and schedules.

"This system is beneficial to students who are looking for housing and roommates," McCreary said.

"We [Student Services] can work around their schedule, rather than making them come into the office and fill out forms."

Students previously had to go through the Office of Student Life and fill out forms to find roommates or housing. With the new database, the paper forms will be discontinued.

There will be a coffee-and-danish hour tomorrow morning in the Blocker Building from 9 to 10 to kick off the new Web site. Free food and promotional items will be available to the general public.

Boyle, who is planning to reapply to A&M, said the incident has made her think twice about coming to school here and she is looking at possibly applying to other universities.

"I don't want to run away, but it's tempting," Boyle said. "I just

don't feel safe here."

Brent Paterson, director of the Department of Student Life, said the University has worked to create a safe environment for all students.

If students engage in acts of violence based on race, gender, or sexual orientation, they will face stiff penalties she said.

Boyle said she plans to press charges against her assailant.

"It's not the people. "Once you fall behind with the production of the Aggieland, it's hard to catch up. That's all it really was, and now it has been corrected."

Swift said producing the Aggieland is a year-long process that takes a lot of time and commitment from all involved in the production of the book.

"It is a full-time job for our staffers," she said. "We work crazy hours. If we are not in class or studying, we work on the book. Our '99 staff was really dedicated, and everybody put a lot of effort in[to] producing this book."

"Eighty to 90 percent of our staff returned, which says a lot about the Aggieland."

The Aggieland is the largest yearbook in the nation with a circulation of 10,000.

Swift said the yearbook will be entered in the Pacemaker competition, a national competition for university newspapers and yearbooks, in July, and the Best-of-Show competition in Atlanta.

"There is no doubt in my mind that the '99 Aggieland is probably the best [year] book that has ever been produced here," she said.

Yearbooks can be purchased for \$37.89 for those who did not choose the option when registering.

The books will be on sale in 015 Reed McDonald and can be paid for with cash, check or credit card.

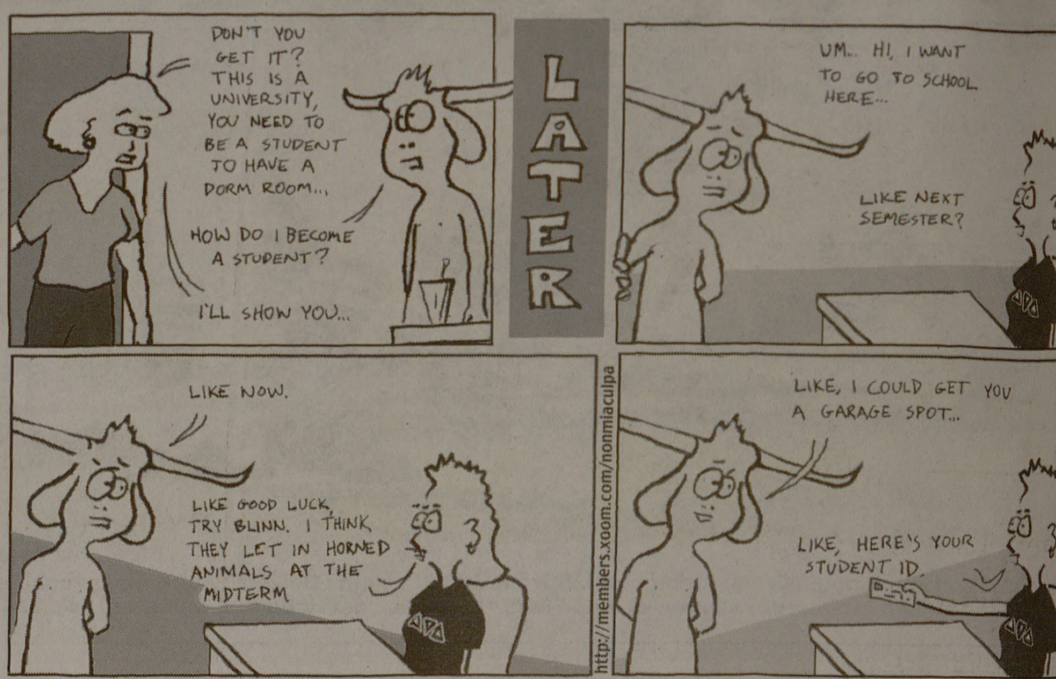

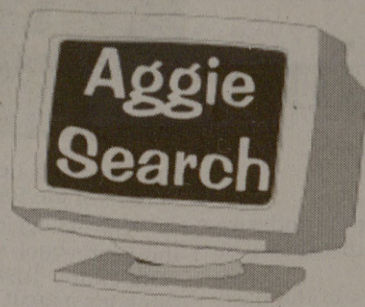

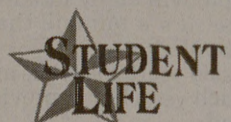
