Dallas' Sanders proves point to Redskins

IRVING, (AP) — Sanders had a point to prove not even a concussion stop him.

Ignoring doctors' warnings, Sanders slipped out of the room, onto the field and end zone to help the Dallas Cowboys finish off the Washington Redskins and their trash-talking receivers in a 38-20 victory Sunday.

"I think it was obvious from the way he played, the love challenge," Dallas coach Gailey said. "He loves the game, and he wants to help us win in any way possible. He's proven that to me, just Sunday."

Sanders was trying to message to the league in specifically Washington to Albert Connell and Westbrock. They said they were not afraid of Sanders, so he had to remind them — and who agreed — why they should be afraid.

But after showing his aggressiveness on the field, Sanders went to the room to recover from a beating hit on a punt return. He back without permission the third quarter, then capped performance with a dazzling yard punt return for a touchdown in the fourth quarter.

Afterward, Sanders told he played a good game and loves him.

"I also let him know that going to hunt rabbits, sometimes ain't no fun if the rabbit has too," Sanders said. "If you're to talk the talk, you had better be able to walk the walk."

"Their receivers are and they have a way to go. Connell and Westbrock feeling cocky because they bined for eight catches, yards and two touchdowns their season-opening meeting. Sanders, though, missed 41-35 overtime win because of this time.

Injury. This time, even Sanders played less than quarters, the pair had five catches for 90 yards, including a 44-yard touchdown by Connell. Mathis covered him on that.

Connell still was not impressed. "Not at all," he said. "I weren't clicking. Deion was factor."

Wrong again, Albert. Sanders' impact was felt the game's first play, when he broke a handoff to Stephen Sanders from his man and took the running back for a 44-yard loss. It was only his fourth loss for a loss in his 11-year career.

Sanders' fire raged again next play as he slugged Connell the elbow. Some would call it a punch; the devout defensive end called it "laying hands on him."

It was not called for a penalty and Sanders probably didn't consider it a sin because he absolved himself in a pregame conversation with Redskins receiver Irvin Fryar, an ordained minister.

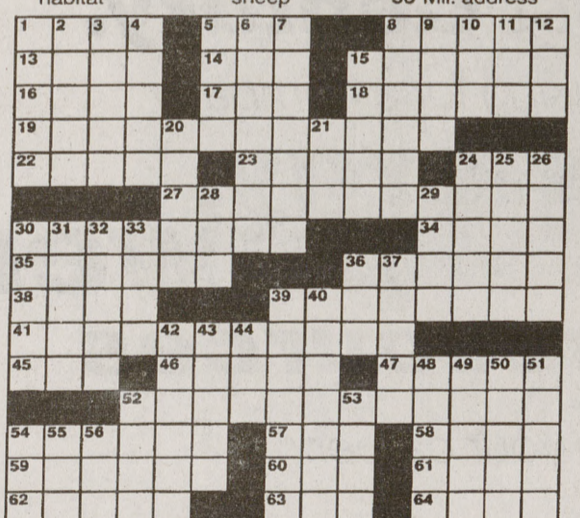
"I told him to please excuse for what I'm about to do," Sanders said. "I knew I was out there to fight a little and it up a little bit."
