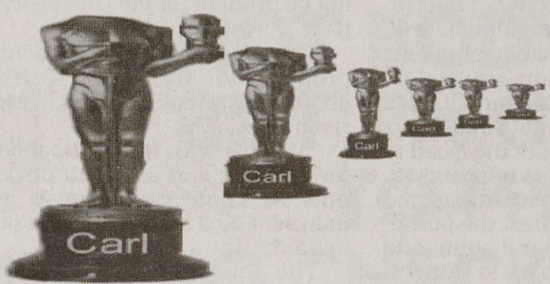

Southside halls to host dance, costume contest

Southside residence halls are bringing the Halloween spirit to campus early by sponsoring the "Hall"-O-Ween Costume Bash, a dance and costume contest, tonight from 7:30 to 11:30 in Duncan Dining Hall.

Shaina Berkowitz, Spence-Briggs Hall council treasurer and a sophomore animal science major, said the sponsors of the dance hope to make it an annual event.

"Our purpose is to bring together the Corps of Cadets and the Southside on-campus residents in a celebration of the Halloween holiday," Berkowitz said. "This dance is basically for Southside residents and the Corps, but we won't turn away anyone from Northside who wants to come."

president and a sophomore civil engineering major, said activities will include a DJ, dancing, a costume contest and refreshments.

Stevenson said students who participate in the contest will be eligible to win prizes from local vendors, including Smoothie King, The Olive Garden, Tattoo Consortium, Inspirations and Chili's restaurant.

Admission to the dance is free, and event T-shirts will be sold for \$7. The costume contest will begin at 9:30 p.m. and will be judged by senior yell leader Bloss, Corps Commander Lane and two Southside residence hall coordinators.

Berkowitz said the costume contest includes five categories: awarded with prizes. Best costume will earn a \$100 gift certificate from Tattoo Consortium; most creative will receive a \$10 gift certificate from The Olive Garden; best costume will be awarded dinner for two at Chili's; scariest will win a \$25 gift certificate from Tattoo Consortium; and cutest costume will win a \$25 gift certificate from Smoothie King.

"You don't have to be a costume to come, but it is a Halloween party," Berkowitz said. After the dance, participants are invited to walk to the Yell Practice as a group.

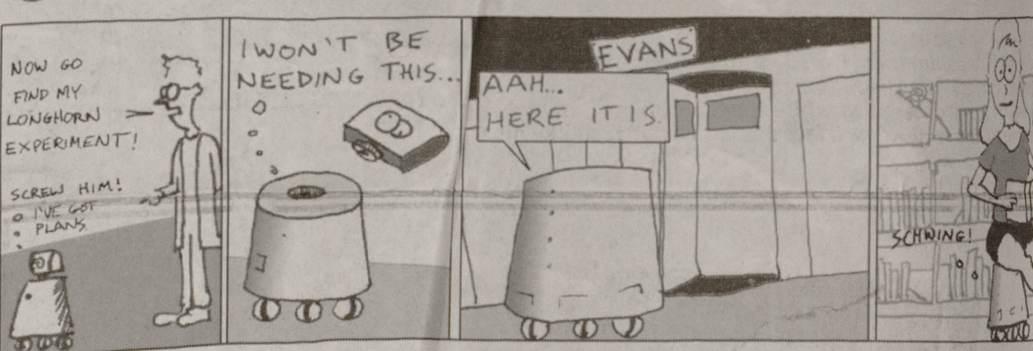
