A new Wes Craven movie opening on Halloween weekend sounds like good business, but just in case the trailers for this movie have escaped anyone's attention, it should be told *Music of the Heart* is not the typical Craven fright fest. Does that make this movie a bad one? Hardly. Craven and Meryl Streep combine to make one of the best feel-good movies of the year.

Horror master Wes Craven (A Nightmare on Elm Street, Scream) breaks out of the genre with this wonderfully directed drama. 
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
