Madden captures 2nd ITA Regional

Texas A&M junior tennis player Shuon Madden won the singles portion of the Intercollegiate Tennis Association Regional yesterday at Texas Christian University. This was the second consecutive year of capturing the title for Madden, who won tournament's singles and doubles draws last season.

Madden, who is ranked 12 nationally, was the tournament's No. 3 seed. He defeated fifth-seeded Oscar Johannsson of Arkansas, 6-3, 6-3, in the final of the tournament. Johannsson ranked No. 35 nationally. Madden receives an automatic bid into the ITA National Indoor Championships held in Dallas early February. Last year, Madden became the first Aggie to win the Regional singles bracket.

A prime example of aggressive style occurred Saturday at the Big Championships at the Texas Golf Course. Bookout ran the hamstring strain against some of the toughest competition in the nation. Keeping in mind that a leg injury in a demanding sport such as cross country can be as painful as a broken bone, she fought through pain to finish first on the 28th and 29th overall.

Bookout said she was disappointed with her performance. "I'm not happy with my performance," she said. "My hamstring held me back a little, but I still have run better than that."

When asked about how she plans to deal with the hamstring if it continues to bother her up to the NCAA Regional Championships, she was quick to discount it as ever being a problem for her again.

"I won't be feeling anything for that race," Bookout said. The Aggies have had their NCAA Regionals, which will be held in two weeks in Denton, their crosshairs all season on their ultimate goal, and for good reason.

The Aggie women have qualified for the NCAA Championships in the history of their program, but Bookout's aggressive style and tenacity, might just be the key to championship luck.

Continued from Page 7 flag was lowered to half-staff at the team's headquarters at Lake Forrest, Ill.

Born July 25, 1954, in Columbia, Miss., Payton played his college football at Jackson State where he set nine school records, scored 3,563 yards. He once scored 46 points in one game.

He led the nation in scoring in 1973 with 160 points. His 464 career points was an NCAA record.

Payton was somewhat undersized for a power running back, but his Minnesota Vikings and non-conference Dennis Green remember yesterday.

"He set a standard for all out," Green said. "He went for it as big as some of the other backs that play Brazos Valley game, but he could outwork anybody and he always won 100 percent. And that was a percent to his family, to his friends, to the game of football, and so is a guy who is really going to be missed."

The following is Payton's nickname: "Sweetness" was a tribute to his personality more than his running style. He was a live runner but often tough. Opposite tacklers with a stiff arm that belied his size.

Payton retired after the 1987 season, and the BVCL immediately retired No. 34.

Payton was elected to the Hall of Fame in 1993, his 11th year of eligibility.

NFL commissioner Tagliabue called Payton one of the greatest players in the history of the sport.
