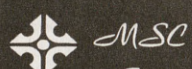

Qualifications for editor in chief of *The Battalion* are:

- Be a Texas A&M student in good standing with the University and enrolled in at least six credit hours (unless fewer credits are required to graduate) during the term of office;
- Have at least a 2.00 cumulative grade point ratio and at least a 2.00 grade point ratio in the semester immediately prior to the appointment, the semester of appointment and semester(s) (all summer course work is considered summer semester) during the term of office. In order for summer school grades to qualify as previous semester grades, a minimum of six hours must be taken during the course of either the full or two summer session(s);
- Have completed JOUR 301 (Mass Communication, Law and Society), or equivalent;
- Have at least one year experience in a responsible editorial position on *The Battalion* or comparable daily college newspaper, -OR- Have at least one year editorial experience on a commercial newspaper, -OR- Have completed at least 12 hours journalism, including JOUR 203 and 303 (Media Writing I and II), and JOUR 304 (Editing for the Mass Media), or equivalent.

have been spliced together. "A special cut was made in the two poles so they would fit together, they were then wrapped with 12 four foot bolts of cable wire, and supported by steel plates," Thompson said. "Finally, the poles are wrapped in 700 to 800 feet of 3/4 inch steel wire."

models of the ecosystem encountered and how they react to changes. Dr. Mahlon Kennicutt, deputy project manager and director of the Geochemical Environmental Research Group at A&M, said this project is one of the largest studies of the deep-sea floor.

"There has been very little work in the deep sea over the past decade," he said.

"There will be several graduate students from A&M who write theses and dissertations out of this project, which increases exposure for the University."

Rowe said this project is a mechanism for the coupling of research and graduate education to give the students first hand

knowledge and experience in this research.

The project team for this is composed of over 45 international researchers from seven different universities and institutions including the University of Mexico at Mexico City, University of South Carolina, the Swedish National Museum, University of Southern Mississippi, the University of Washington, Los Angeles County Museum,
