Harriers ready for South Central Regional

The long wait for the Texas A&M men's and women's cross country teams is over. The meet the Aggie Harriers have been focusing on all year, the NCAA South Central Regional in Denton, is finally upon them Saturday.

The top two qualifiers from this and other regional meets will receive automatic bids to the national meet, while 13 at-large bids will be awarded Nov. 15 to round out a field of 31 teams in both the men's and women's divisions at the NCAA Championships.

Although the Aggie women have never qualified for the NAAs and the men have not qualified since 1982, this year's team is optimistic about their chances.

Second-year A&M cross country coach Dave

Hartman said he is pleased with the men's chances because of their performances earlier this season.

The Aggie men currently are ranked fourth in the Region behind the University of Arkansas, Rice University and the University of Texas.

"Our training has us peaking at the right time of the year," Hartman said. "We have some confidence because we were right there with Texas two weeks ago [at the Big 12 meet], and we are going to have to fight it out with them and Rice for that second spot behind Arkansas."

"We could really make some noise at this meet, because we've got several guys who are experienced at this level in [Scott] Lengefeld and [Stephen] Erath. Plus, Carl Stewart always runs well at North Texas, and our younger runners were here last year and they know what kind of effort it takes to get that automatic bid."

Hartman said he is just as confident with the

women's team this year because their and performances thus far this season. Aggie women come into the meet with ranking in the region, but Hartman said he expects a higher ranking.

"Our women should also be peaking for the meet," Hartman said. "The ninth-place ranking in the Big 12 is kind of misleading, because we were ranked in the top 10 nationally, and we were not that far out of the top seven."

"I look for the girls to run their best this season and really surprise some of the people they did last year [tied for fifth with Texas A&M], because they are very young, but most of them are very young, so they understand the level of competition will be very high. We'll need our runners to step up and finish in the top 15 in order to knock off Baylor for second place behind Arkansas."

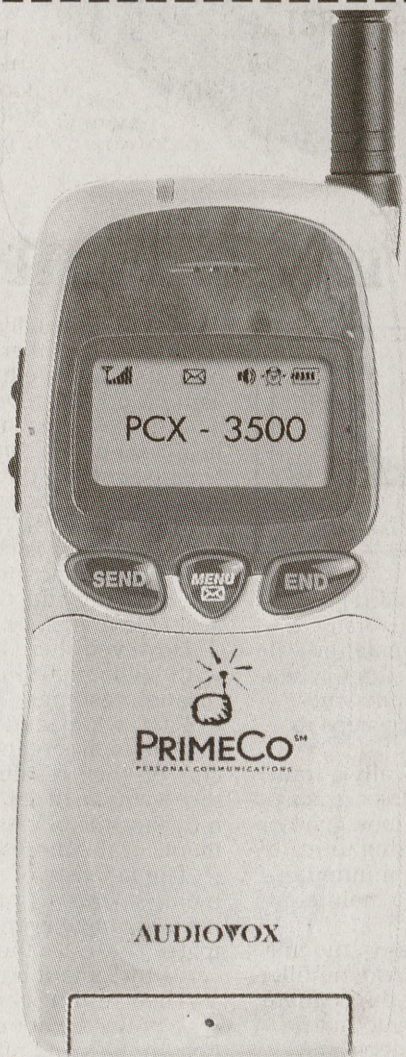
