Nick Anderson and Scott, teammates at Lab University High in Baton Rouge, La., have signed national letters-of-intent to play basketball at Texas A&M, men's basketball coach Melvin Watkins said Tuesday.
Anderson, a 6-foot 7-inch forward, is a 6-foot 1-inch guard, and Scott is a 6-foot 2-inch guard. Anderson is a second straight national recruiting class by his staff, who last year had a class that ranked 20 nationally.
Anderson, ranked 18 prospect in the The Sporting News, is the highest rated national A&M history.
