history, when a colony was beginning 300 years ago.

"There is no other lab in Northern America which can handle this volume of artifacts, especially including the ship itself," she said.

"There are approximately 381 artifacts which must remain in water to prevent them from drying out and shrinking.

"Approximately one million artifacts must be conserved and at one point, every single thing has to be touched by a conservator's hand."

Jobling said The Belle will be conserved completely within six months.

"There are about two to five people working daily on the artifacts," he said, "and there is a web camera focused on the 96,000 gallon tank in which the ship is being put back together."

Dewolf said artifacts, including the hull of the ship, three bronze cannons, rings, more than 60,000 lead shots, muskets, 500 feet of rope and even the skeleton of a crew member were among the remains found in the excavation.

Dewolf said the project has been in its conservation phase since 1997, in which every artifact off of The Belle is being carefully identified, cleaned and preserved.

Jobling said La Salle's ship will be displayed at the new Texas Historical Museum in Austin after the conservation of the artifacts and ship.

Dufour said the actual stopping sites are kept secret due to possible harassment from juniors and underclassmen.

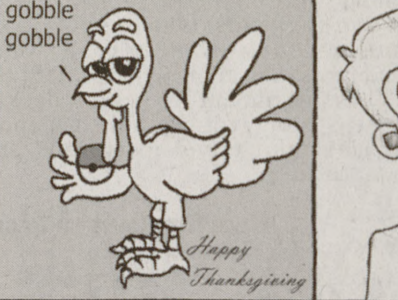
"We keep the areas around campus a secret, mainly for safety reasons," she said.

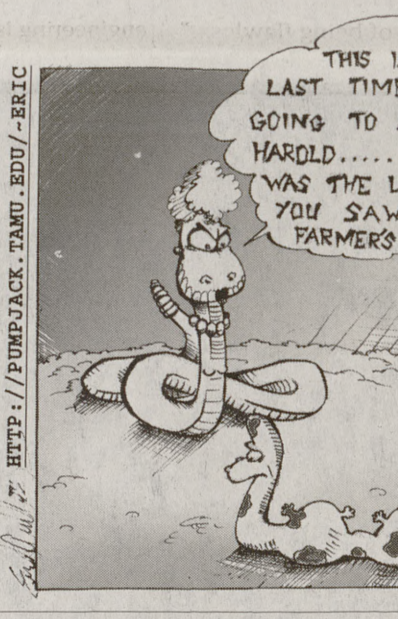

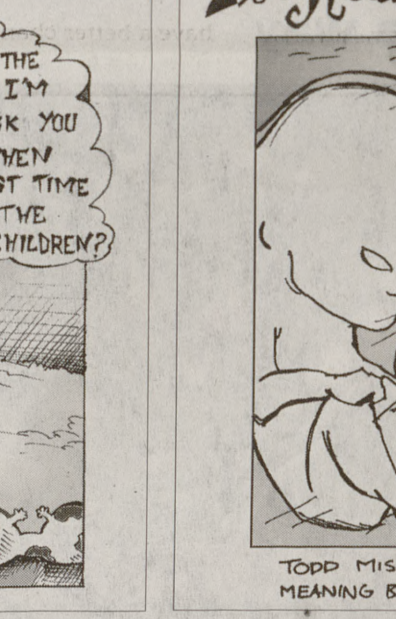
