

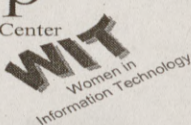

Chechen forces under fire Russians urged to negotiate

GROZNY, Russia (AP) — Chechen forces came under heavy fire in Grozny and two nearby towns yesterday, but the Russian military acknowledged that the militants were well-entrenched in the Chechen capital.

A top European human rights official, meanwhile, urged Russia to stop the fighting and negotiate a settlement.

Chechen military commander Isa Munayev said a number of people had been killed in Grozny, while the Russians had lost a large number of soldiers and armored vehicles, the Interfax news agency reported.

The Russians concentrated their airstrikes and artillery shelling on Grozny and on two satellite towns — Argun and Urus-Martan.

Munayev said the fighting was particularly intense at Urus-Martan, where the militants came under "drenching fire."

As with earlier operations, the Russians have been bombarding the militants from afar in the expectation that the rebels will retreat without a full-scale infantry battle.

The strategy worked well, bringing the Russians to the outskirts of Grozny on the north, east and west. But the rebel fighters have resisted much more fiercely in recent days as the fighting has approached the capital.

In Argun, three miles east of Grozny, and in Urus-Martan, about 10 miles southwest of the capital, the militants have appeared much more willing to remain and fight.

The Council of Europe's human rights commissioner Alvaro Gil-Robles, who returned from a two-day trip to Chechnya and nearby regions today, urged negotiations.

"We believe that a democratic country, and Russia is a democratic country, cannot use just any means to fight terrorism," Gil-Robles told journalists in Moscow. "This war must be ended as soon as possible, and a political dialogue must begin."

Russia claims that its strikes are aimed against Chechnya's militants, who are blamed for a series of terrorist

bombings in Russia, but Chechen authorities and human rights groups all say that hundreds of civilians have also been killed.

The Kremlin has shrugged off international pressure to stop the offensive, which is largely popular among Russians weary of widespread crime they blame Chechens and other Caucasus Mountains militants.

Russian air force bombers dropped 1,100-pound explosive bombs Wednesday on Grozny and Urus-Martan. The air force also employed huge concrete bombs for what they said was a successful attack on an underground arms depot.

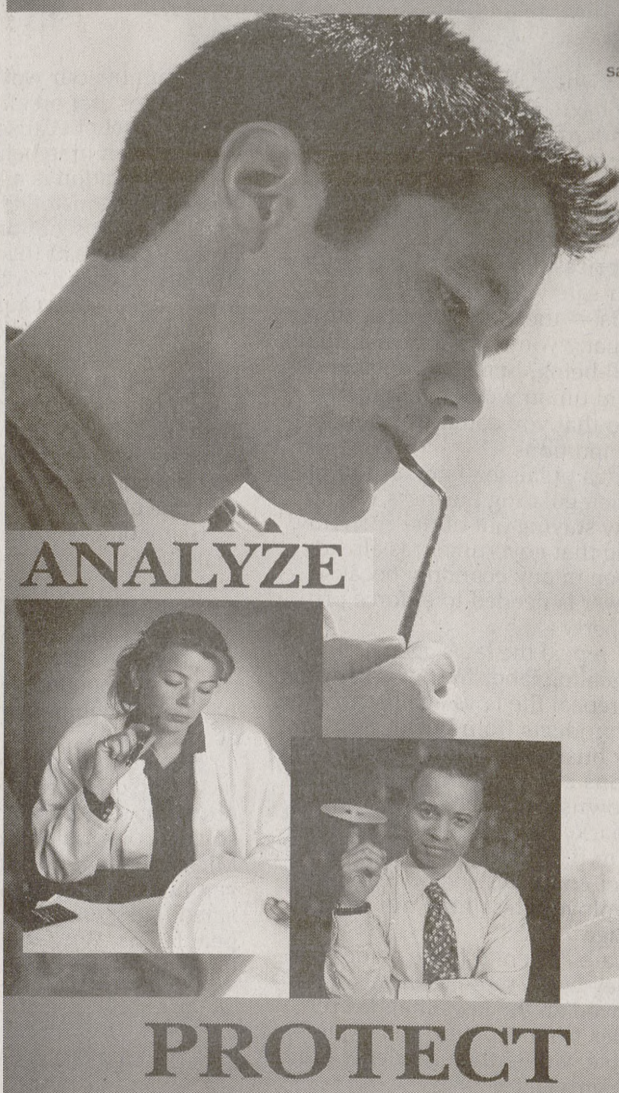
