Police confirm 3 boys killed in crash

FORT WORTH (AP) — Several of a fatal wreck's victims identified by police as members of a nomadic Irish clan were under the age of 15 when their truck became airborne, flipped and slammed into another vehicle.

Police have confirmed the ages of three of five young cousins killed Jan. 2 when the truck — driven by a 14-yearold — careened out of control. Some had carried identification indicating they were 20 years old.

The accident, which happened at midday on Interstate 30, puzzles police who say they still haven't talked with parents of the boys, part of a clan of nomads known as Greenhorn Irish Travelers.

"They've insulated themselves well," Sgt. Anne Cummings of the Fort Worth Police Department's traffic division said

However, Cummings said at least his birth, but had a year that made him nine vehicles carrying people who said they were family members showed up at the wreck site before authorities had even identified the victims.

"I've been on the scene of over 150 to 200 fatal accidents ... the probability of having one family member drive up on (the scene of an accident) is maybe one out of 10," said Cummings. "But they were pulling up in droves. It just blew my mind."

Authorities began questioning the ages of the victims after a funeral program indicated the boys were 12 to 14 years old.
