News in Brief Drifter confesses; killed 10 children

RIO DE JANEIRO, Brazil (AP) - A drifter charged with sexual abuse and murder in Sao Paulo state has confessed to killing at least 10 children over a 20-year period, police said Tuesday.

Larete Patrocinio Orpinelli, 47, a drifter with a long history of violent behavior, confessed to three murders shortly after he was arrested on Jan. 14 in Rio Claro, police chief Sueli Isler Batelochi said. In subsequent days, he confessed to seven more killings and led police to the bodies.

Police said the victims, both boys and girls, ranged in age from five to 11. It was unclear exactly when each victim was killed.

'He said nightmares he was having made him to confess to the crimes," Batelochi said by telephone from Rio Claro, 250 miles west of Rio de Janeiro.

Orpinelli, who earned a modest living greasing the runners of the steel doors on bars and restaurants, had been committed to psychiatric hospitals five times between 1967 and 1993. He said he was driven to kill the children after he was unable to perform sexually.

President says he is free from military

QUITO, Ecuador (AP) Ecuador's new president declared Tuesday that his government is not under the sway of military officers who toppled his predecessor and put him in charge of this troubled Andean nation.

Gustavo Noboa, who Ecuador's vice president until President Jamil Mahuad was removed last week, said on television Tuesday that he was not beholden to the military generals who put him in power.

"Absolutely not," he said. "I am here because I am fulfilling a duty that I will carry out well.'




