With 30,000 troops in Lebanon, Syria is its neighbor's main power broker. Israel has longed maintained that Syria has tacitly approved — and in some cases, encouraged — the flow of arms to Hezbollah

In the Defense Ministry statement, Barak used language that in the past has foreshadowed a major Israeli counterattack. "We have known in the past, and we still know, {how} to strike at the place and time of our choosing,"he said.

Barak described the recent violence, including the death of another Israeli soldier last week, as a "grave intensification ... that Israel would not al-
