The five additions to the soccer team ook to build on the already solid founlation A&M coach G. Guerrieri has built or the 2000 season. With the Aggies nly losing a handful of seniors this seaon, A&M will return almost a complete starting line-up.

#### to USA Junior team


Texas A&M men's basketball signee Nick Anderson of Baton Rouge, La., has been named to the 2000 USA Basketball Men's Junior National Select Team by USA Basketball's Cadet and Youth Committee and will compete in the 2000 NABC/Nike International Hoop Summit on April 2 in Indianapolis, Ind.

The sixth annual NABC/Nike International Hoop Summit is an international game benefitting the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame.

It features the USA Basketball Junior National Select Team comprised of 12 of the United States' top high school senior boy basketball players and an International Select Team consisting of the top 20-year-old and younger players from around the world.

The 2000 Hoop Summit will be on Sunday, April 2 at 1 p.m. (EDT) at the Conseco Fieldhouse in Indianapolis, Ind. The USA vs. Internationals match-up will be held in conjunction with the NCAA Men's Final Four and will be televised live on ESPN.

The Aggies have made plans to upgrade and modernize their facilities, but something needs to be done sooner rather than later.


While A&M will still sign quality people, talented recruits have been and will be driven away because of perceptions.


