## Alaska Air cockpit recorder reviewed

Calif. (AP) — The cock- keeps the plane level. pit voice recorder recovered from the Pacific details the Alaska Airlines crew desperately trying to regain control as the jetliner carrying 88 people flew upside down before crashing, federal investigators said Thursday.

The recorder captured slightly more than 30 minutes of conversation, National Transportation Safety Board Chairman James Hall told reporters in Washington.

"The crew made references to being inverted that are consistent with the witness statements to that effect," Hall said.

The tape starts with the crew discussing a problem with a part of the tail control, called the hor-

The crew had difficulty controlling the airplane's tendency to pitch nose down. The airplane descended, but the crew was able to arrest the descent. The crew continued troubleshooting and preparing the airplane for landing. Then control was suddenly lost."

Hall's account came from an initial review of the cockpit voice recorder, which was recovered Wednesday from the debris of the MD-83. Searchers Thursday

### Poor students perform better in small schools

schools reduce the harmful effects of poverty on student achievement and help narrow the achievement gap between poor students and those from wealthier communities, officials from a national group studying rural schools said Thursday.

The Rural School and Community Trust examined every public school in Texas, Ohio, Montana and Georgia to determine what effects poverty has on student achievement and how those effects changed depending on the schools' size. Only schools that did not have appropri-

With a high school band playing and former Gov. Ann Richards lending her support, Microsoft "adopted" the town of approximately 1,900 tax filers Thursday. The company was publicizing its Mi-

crosoft TaxSaver tax preparation soft-

ware, new to the marketplace this tax season. It's also playing off the name of the Hill Country town, suggesting that the new software will provide comfort for taxpayers. Microsoft hopes to get all tax filers in Comfort to use its software and at least 25 percent to file electronically. Last

year, only about 15 percent of Comfort residents filed taxes electronically, and even fewer were believed to have used personal software. The company is opening two free tax preparation and filing centers — one at the community center on the town's main street and one at the high school — and

TaxSaver, said company spokeswoman Gayle Cruise. Free help will be provided throughout the spring by members of the Texas chapter of the National Association of Tax Practitioners.
