NFC wins Pro Bowl over AFC

HONOLULU (AP) — Randy Moss set records with nine catches for 145 yards, and Mike Altstott scored two touchdowns in the AFC's 51-31 victory over the AFC on Sunday in the highest scoring Pro Bowl ever.

Arizona's Aeneas Williams set interception records for touchdowns in snapping a three-game AFC streak.

Moss, the 6-foot-4 Minnesota star, led the MVP, used his height advantage to outleap the AFC defense backs, particularly 5-11 Sam McConkey of Miami and 6-foot James Haslam of Kansas City.

Moss' last catch was a 25-yard reception from Carolina's Steve Beale with 1:05 left to play that closed the scoring.

Altstott, the Tampa Bay fullback, scored on runs of 1, 3 and 1 yards, finished with 13 carries for 67 yards.

Brooks picked off a pass from Jacksonville quarterback Mark Brunell and raced untouched 20 yards for a touchdown to make it 44-24 with 1:12 left.

Jaguars receiver Jimmy Smith caught three touchdown passes, finished with eight catches for 119 yards.

His last score, a 52-yarder from Indianapolis' Peyton Manning, made it 31 with 6:30 left to play.

World team wins NHL all-star game

TORONTO (AP) — A rout of the NHL All-Star game. Pavel Bure scored three goals — and goaltender Ed Snider played a rare shutout period in the World team turned the 5th All-Star game into an uncommon rout, dominating North America 9-4 on Sunday.

Bure's brother, Valeri, again played a key role by assisting on Pavel's first two goals.

The Russian Rocket's third goal came as the World stars erupted for four goals in the third period, all against goalie Ray Grant of the New York Rangers.

The hat trick was the 11th in All-Star history, but the fourth in four years.

That is what made Kolzig's shutout period so unusual, and his play helped the World stretch a 5-4 lead at the start of the period into a blowout.

Pavel Demitra of St. Louis scored the second goal and Miroslav Satan of Ottawa and Radek of Ottawa also scored in the third period.
