Muslims, Christians discuss social justice

"People who believe in God have many things in common. What we can most work on is the aspect of being compassionate. There is a need for a prophetic voice in American society — this is something we can unite on and work for."

These were the words of Dr. Ihsan Bagby, a professor of International Studies at Shaw University in North Carolina, concerning the similarities of Christianity and Islam at the Muslim Student Association (MSA) presentation of "Social Justice in Islam and Christianity" Thursday.

The program consisted of a panel discussion with two guest speakers, Bagby and Dr. Bob Mayfield, director of Baptist Student Ministry at Texas A&M.

Bagby began his speech by opening with the traditional greetings of Muslims, "May God's peace be with you," and immediately began discussing the importance of social justice to Islam.

"Social justice is a very important concept in Islam. In the Quran, God commands humans to be just," Bagby said. Bagby said the Islamic concept of justice is linked to righteousness, and one of the primary goals of Islam is to establish a just, righteous society.

In his comparison of Islam and Christianity, he said that both religions believe in the same God, and that this

God demands Christians and follow his will and implement "To establish a society that God's will — this is a theme for monotheistic faiths," Bagby said. Bagby also said he believed succeeded in establishing this "We have to realize we are The whole body has to be with the hurt of any part — health and success depends on Bagby said. ing what is right and I look to Scripture what I call right," Mayfield said.

Mayfield said it is necessary for Christians to ask themselves, "what they are doing involve righteousness and justice?"

He concluded by stating the importance of mercy as well as justice. "Mercy is the practice of judgment the way we want to be judged," Mayfield said. "Mercy is something should practice because when we practice it, we are then free to model justice."

The Muslim Student Association also sponsors a biweekly class called lam 101, which informs participants about Islamic principles.

"There are a lot of willing people here, [recruitment] seems to be picking up here and hopefully the numbers will start to increase."

The reason for Texas A&M having low numbers of volunteers could be the small amount of time recruiters spend on campus, said Bob Kirby, a Peace Corps recruiter.

"I believe in a couple of years you will see Texas A&M in the top 15," he said. "We plan on going down there [to College Station] and getting things started."

The idea of the Peace Corps being a liberal organization could also be a reason

for the low number of A&M volunteers, but he does not feel the image of the organization being liberal is true.

"I believe the image the Peace Corps has as being liberal is somewhat misleading," Kirby said.

Niemeyer said the Peace Corps seeks people who can take leadership roles and help their host communities with projects.

Skalsky aids the recruitment process at A&M by talking about her Peace Corps experiences in the botany labs she teaches. Some students interested in joining have talked to her, she said.

"The experience was definitely good, by no means enjoyable everyday or easy," Skalsky said. "They were the most difficult two years of my life."
