Women's golf hosts tourney

The Texas A&M University women's golf team will open its spring season differently this season.

Instead of defending the Aggies' home turf with their host tournament, the "Mo" Memorial Invitational, the tournament will be played at Pine Forest Country Club in Houston.

"It's a little different not defending your home turf," A&M women's golf coach Jeanne Sutherland said, "but it's important to win your own tournament."

The Aggies moved the site of the "Mo" Memorial to Pine Forest to attract a better field of teams and to play on a more difficult terrain.

Sutherland claims that by moving the tournament to Pine Forest the Aggies will play on a course that is in "perfect condition," while hosting half a dozen strong teams — making the tournament a true challenge for the young Aggies.

The tournament is named after the late Monica Walsh who holds the low record for the Aggie women.

No. 38 A&M will host a 16-team field that includes No. 22 University of Oklahoma, No. 26 University of Nebraska and defending tournament champion No. 3 University of Missouri. Baylor University, Texas Tech University, the University of Colorado and Kansas State University round out the Big 12's appearance at the meet.

The Aggies will play without two of their leading scorers. No. 42 Anna Johnson, a sophomore, is out with a back injury while sophomore McKenzie Dye has a wrist injury.

The Aggies fell one second and one point short as Nebraska edged out the relay for second place.

Nash said that the one-on-one atmosphere between A&M and ISU enabled swimmers from both sides to maintain a competitive spirit in an UT-dominated meet.

"It was really fun to have a team meet with ISU like that," Nash said. "So often you are stuck in no man's land entrenched in second or entrenched in third. It gave us something to chase after, and the team responded beautifully."

"They swam phenomenally well. As the meet wore on they got a little bit more in their comfort zone and I was really pleased with how they responded. We had so many lifetime bests and people kept improving."
