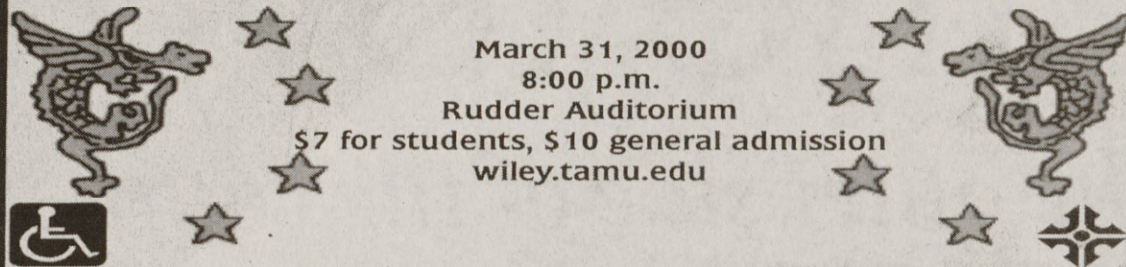

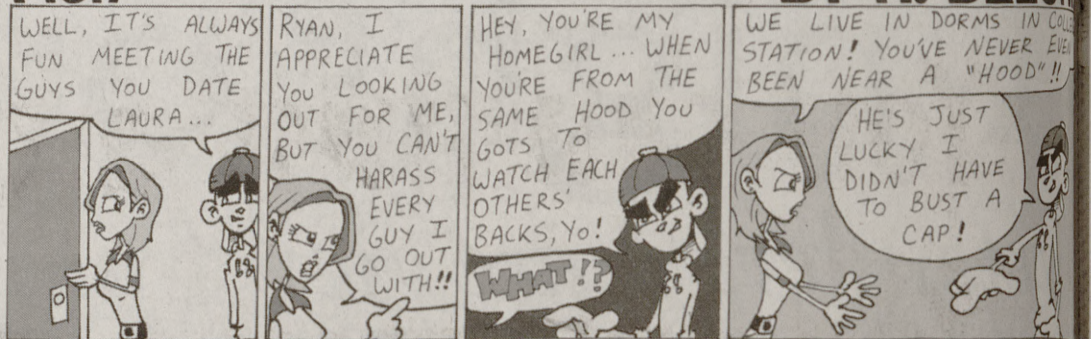

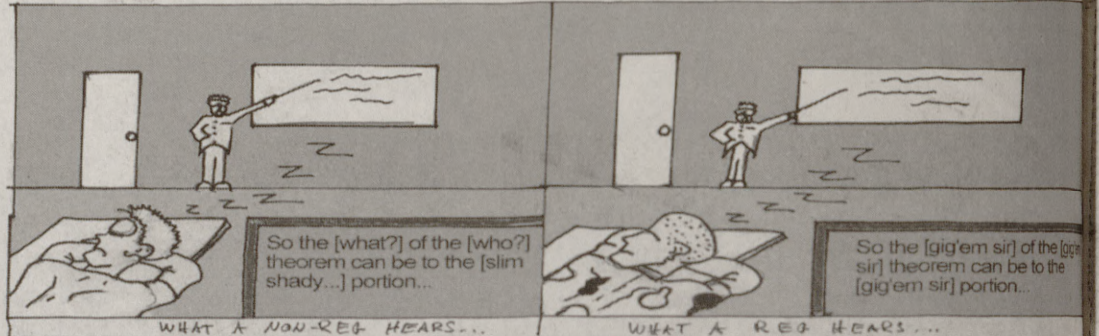

#### Oscar theft suspect pleads innocent

LOS ANGELES (AP) — A trucking company employee pleaded innocent Tuesday to stealing 55 Oscar statuettes that later turned up in a trash bin.

Roadway Express employee Lawrence Edward Ledent, 38, charged with grand theft, was ordered held in lieu of \$20,000 bail.

His attorney, Jay Jaffe, said outside court that Ledent was "a dupe in this matter" and did not steal the Oscars. Jaffe said he believes that police think there were at least five people involved in the theft.

Another Roadway Express employee arrested in the case, Anthony Keith Hart, 38, was not charged because there was insufficient evidence, said Sandi Gibbons, a district attorney spokeswoman.

The Oscars were manufactured by a Chicago company at a cost of about \$18,000 and were shipped on March 3. They arrived at Roadway Express' warehouse in Bell, Calif., on March 8 and then disappeared.

Fifty-two of the gold-plated stat-

uettes were recovered last weekend by a man who was scavenging in a trash bin. Whereabouts of the other three Oscars remained unknown Tuesday, but there were plenty of statuettes available for Sunday's ceremony.

#### Airport to be named for 'Peanuts' artist

SANTA ROSA, Calif. (AP) — An airport will be named for "Peanuts" creator Charles Schulz.

Sonoma County supervisors Tuesday approved a resolution changing the name of Sonoma County Airport to "Charles M. Schulz — Sonoma County Airport" for the late cartoonist.

Schulz, who died Feb. 12 at his home in Santa Rosa after a battle with colon cancer, kept an airplane at the airport.

Some of his family members are pilots, said county Supervisor Paul Kelley, who made the proposal.

#### Power plant's critics seek Brockovich's aid

SALEM, Mass. (AP) — Critics of power plant are looking for a little help from the real Erin Brockovich.

Brockovich, whose battle against Pacific Gas & Electric Co. in California is the subject of a new Julia Roberts movie, plans to attend an April 18 fund-raiser for opponents of the Salem plant.

The money will go to Salem Power Plant HealthLink's efforts to persuade Gov. Paul Cellucci to make older power plants reduce their emissions, said group member Lynn Nadeau.

Brockovich, a legal investigator who helped win a lawsuit against PG&E after alleging the PG&E plant in California was making people sick.

PG&E also owns the Salem station. Utility spokeswoman Lisa Frank called Brockovich's visit a "public stunt" to put more pressure on Cellucci.
