"[The department tries] to find people interested in giving money to A&M."

"The college justifies certain things that they want funded. For example, they are building a trading room which will teach students to be commodities traders," McKee said.

McKee said that although she does not interact directly with students, she has always been indirectly involved with student organizations.

"I will be happy to help in that area. I can offer guidance and mentorship in their fund raising to keep their clubs and activities going," McKee said.
