NEW YORK (AP) — The Washing- 1 for Arrington or Brown. ton Redskins have maneuvered their way up in the NFL draft with one player in mind — LaVar Arrington, this year's "next Lawrence Taylor."

But the Skins' best laid plans could go awry with one sentence from commissioner Paul Tagliabue: "With the first pick in the 2000 NFL draft, the Cleveland Browns (or New York Jets) select linebacker LaVar Arrington of Penn State.' Sure, with the second and third picks

Thus the intrigue of draft week. It started in earnest Tuesday when the New York Jets agreed to send disgruntled wide receiver Keyshawn Johnson to Tampa Bay for the Bucs' two first-round picks and either Bert Emmanuel or Reidel Anthony. The deal will go forward if Johnson and the Bucs can agree on a contract before noon Saturday, when the draft starts.

That would give New York, which already has two first-round choices, the 13th, 16th, 18th and 27th picks, perhaps enough to trade up with Cleveland to No.

"If someone came to us with four first-round picks, we'd have to do it," Dwight Clark, Cleveland's personnel chief, said last week, probably tipping his hand too soon.


