'The fact that the letters didn't say anything explicit, like I love you or I need you, says a lot. Mercedes would have demanded that from her lover and pasted it in her Bible," said Garbo biographer Karen Swenson. "But, it still left the question mark there. People will interpret things however they want to. "For anyone to have expected she would say anything explicitly was contrary to Garbo's character," Swenson said. The museum would not allow any excerpts of the letters to be directly quoted, citing the wishes of the Garbo


estate, which is reserving the right to publish the material. Some of the letters reveal a friendship that involved visits and birthday wishes.



Acosta gave the letters to the Rosenbach in 1960 with the stipulation that they not be opened until 10 years after th of Garbo or 4 osta w


