CDC suggests beer tax lowers STD rates

ATLANTA (AP) — Cheap beer is a leading contributor to the spread of sexually transmitted diseases, according to a government report that says raising the tax on a six-pack by 20 cents could reduce gonorrhea by up to 9 percent.

The Centers for Disease Control (CDC) and Prevention study, released Thursday, compared changes in gonorrhea rates to changes in alcohol policy in all states from 1981 to 1995. In years following beer tax increases, gonorrhea rates usually dropped among young people. The same happened when the drinking age went up — as it did in many states during the 1980s.

"Alcohol has been linked to risky sexual behavior among youth. It influences a person's judgment and they are more likely to have sex without a condom, with multiple partners or with high-risk partners," said Harrell Cheson, a health economist with the Centers for Disease Control

mist with the CDC.

Beer industry lobbyists, however, said recent statistics show young people are already drinking more responsibly, thanks in part to efforts by brewers.

"Excise taxes have little or nothing to do with alcohol abuse in society," said Lori Levy of The Beer Institute in Washington. "I think that our members understand the importance of educating young people about how to make responsible choices once they're old enough and they put a lot of money and effort into those programs."

Gonorrhea, one of the most common venereal diseases, was examined by the CDC because long-term statistics are available and the disease is more evenly spread among states.

The CDC analyzed the drops in gonorrhea rates following different tax increases and came up with the estimate that 20-cent increase per six-pack would lead to a 9 percent drop in gonorrhea rates.

Press, Lockwood claims he accidentally shot Kujawa in the back of the head, and then hid the body in the trunk of Kujawa's car.

Two days later, Lockwood drove Kujawa's vehicle to a ranch west of Austin and disposed of the body. He then drove to College Station, where he left the car at Easterwood Airport in long-term parking.

It is unclear where the shooting took place. Authorities said records indicate that Kujawa did not take a flight from the airport during the weekend of April 7, but because witness accounts state that he did board an airplane, the matter will be investigated further.

Lockwood was arrested at a San Antonio hospital, where he was a patient, according to a statement from the Hays County Sheriff's Department.

Lockwood was released from Methodist Specialty and Transplant Hospital and was taken to the Hays County Jail shortly after his arrest.

Hospital spokesperson Palmira Arellano declined to

comment on why Lockwood was hospitalized.

Texas A&M University officials and the Associated Former Students did not comment on whether a \$250,000 reward offered yesterday for information in the case of the arrest. Investigators would not comment on whether reward led to the arrest.

"At this point, the investigation will go on to see if anyone else throughout the country was contacted by Lockwood posing as 'Kelly,'"

"We do not know the extent of his activities during the nation," he said.

Wiatt said Lockwood would email and post pictures of attractive girls and say they were of "Kelly" and then to be "Kelly's" brother when he met in person with him talked with in chatrooms or through email.

Wiatt could not comment on the possibility of sexual assault in the case, but said an autopsy could reveal information.

However, it is possible that any information relating to the autopsy would not be released until the suspect goes to court. Lockwood is being held on a \$250,000 bond.
