## **Run for the Roses** Lukas confident, ready for 126th running of Kentucky Derby

LOUISVILLE, Ky. (AP) — D. Wayne Lukas thinks the hardfirst Kentucky Derby is to remove when he was kicked by a pony themselves from the hoopla and concentrate on the task at hand.

D. Wayne knows Derby. On Saturday, the 64-year-old Hall of Fame trainer will saddle High Yield, Commendable and Exchange Rate, his 36th, 37th and 38th starters, in a quest for his fifth victory at his 20th consecutive Derby at Churchill Downs.

'The biggest mistake you can make is to run horses that don't belong, and we're all guilty of that," Lukas said Thursday. "Some people run a horse because they have an honest fantasy that they have a chance, when in reality they don't."

The Bears, who are the No. 5 national seed, earned the No. 1 seed in the re-


