Carruth offered plea bargain for murder

CHARLOTTE, N.C. (AP) — Prosecutors have offered plea bargains to four men charged in the shooting death of Carruth's girlfriend, The Charlotte Observer reported Sunday.

Prosecutors have decided to give four men the chance to plead guilty to second-degree murder and avoid a capital murder trial, sources told The Observer.

Carruth, 26, and the other men charged with first-degree murder in the Nov. 16 shooting of Charles Adams, Adams, 24, was pregnant with Carruth's baby when she was gunned down while driving in southeast Charlotte. Chancellor Adams was delivered by emergency Caesarean section.

Neither the prosecutors nor defense attorneys would comment on reports of the plea offers. Documents in court files confirm that prosecutors have sent letters to all four defendants concerning pleas.

Carruth's lawyer, David Rudolf, said his client isn't interested in plea bargaining.

"I am not going to comment on communications from the DA's office," Rudolf told The Observer. "I can say that Rae Carruth is not interested in anything other than a trial to clear his name."

Contacted by The Associated Press late Saturday night, Rudolf said he had "no comment" on the plea bargaining offer.

Carruth has been jailed since Dec.

15, and Rudolf wants Carruth tried before the end of the year.

Carruth, Van Brett Watkins, Michael Eugene Kennedy, 24, and Stanley Drew "Boss" Abraham, each would face life in prison or a death penalty if convicted of first-degree murder.

The four men also are each charged with conspiring to commit murder, shooting into an occupied vehicle and using a gun to try to kill Adams' unborn child.

The plea offers call for different levels of punishment based on the defendants' alleged role in the slaying and criminal records. Carruth could face as much as 30 years in prison, according to the newspaper's sources.

Carruth and Watkins, alleged court documents as the triggermen, must both plead guilty for their deaths to be accepted by prosecutors. The deals call for them to plead guilty to second-degree murder and conspiring to commit murder, a source said. The sentences would run consecutively.

Watkins, who has a criminal record, would get the harshest punishment, a source said.

Prosecutors have agreed to let Kennedy plead guilty to second-degree murder and conspiracy to commit murder and serve eight to 30 years, sources said.

Kennedy would also have to testify about Carruth and the other defendants, sources said.

Abraham's offer calls for him to plead guilty solely to second-degree murder, sources said. He could be offered 20 years in prison. Abraham's offer also requires him to submit to further interviews with investigators, sources said.

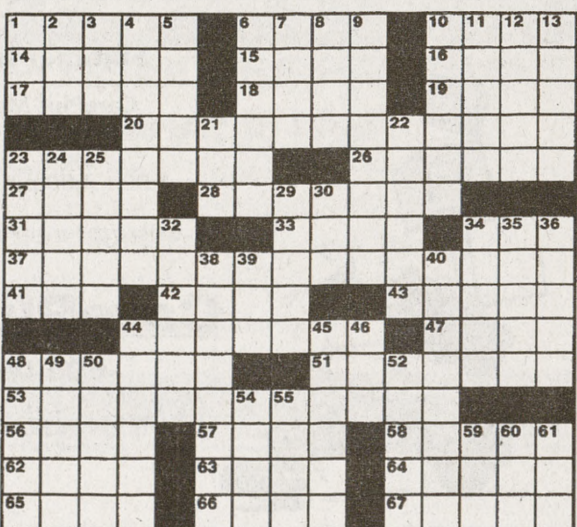
