## Tim McGraw arrested, charged with assault

ORCHARD PARK, N.Y. (AP)— An attorney for country music star Tim McGraw's band said the singer's arrest for allegedly attacking deputies was a "misunderstanding."

McGraw and country music singer Kenny Chesney were arrested Saturday night near Buffalo. The sheriff's office said Chesney rode away with a deputy's horse and McGraw attacked deputies who tried to corral him.

"They only thought they had permission to ride the horse," said Tom Eoannou, the band's attorney. "It's a clear misunderstanding. Clearly it's over riding a horse and I don't think these charges will stick at all."

The daughter of Erie Sheriff's Department Capt. James Coyle gave Chesney permission to sit on her fa-

ther's horse. Chesney allegedly rode away after refusing several orders to stop. When two deputies tried to get him off the horse, they were attacked by McGraw, Staebell said. One of McGraw's managers, Mark Russo, also got involved, Staebell said.

McGraw, of Brentwood, Tenn., was fined on \$2,500 bail after he was charged with second-degree assault, obstructing governmental administration, menacing and assisting armed Chesney, 32, Nashville, was charged with disorderly conduct and freed on \$5,000 bail.

The two had headlined Saturday night at the George Strait Country Music Festival.

workers to daytime shifts," Duncan said.

Duncan said Kinko's is hoping to receive student feedback about their new hours of operation, as this is the first time they have been changed.

Rother's Bookstore, on College Avenue has also changed their hours for the summer semesters.

Kim Claburn, assistant manager at Rother's and Class of '99, said Rother's had to decrease their staff, since there is less work for the employees during the summer.

"We cut back on hours because there are less people and less work with books to do," Claburn said. Claburn said summer business at Rother's has not been affected by the change in business hours.

"Relative to the business the spring and fall semesters bring in, our business has been affected, but as far as the summer budget, business has been great," Claburn said.

Although some students are upset about the change in hours, employees

for the most part are excited. "We are ecstatic [about the summer hours]," Claburn said. "We want a summer too."

Though employees are enjoying the fewer hours, students find the change in hours aggravating.

"It was frustrating to get used to some of the different hours because I didn't know the hours would be changing," said Trissa Campbell, senior sociology major. "I would go somewhere and it would have a 'closed' sign out front."

"Now that I know the hours have changed, it doesn't affect me at all," Campbell said. "I understand they are closed for a reason."

While some students do not mind the change in hours, others are a little upset.

"McDonald's is my primary source of food at all times since it is open 24 hours a day and is closest to my apartment," said Laura Lee, senior management major. "Now I have to drive across town just to get a meal deal."

Some students are not upset about the inconveniences the changes in hours have brought on, but feel that the businesses in town should maintain their regular hours all year.

"I feel that the businesses should strive to serve the Aggie community year-long," Lee said. "They should want to stay open for the students who are still in town because we are their customers year round."

All businesses will resume their regular hours when the semester begins.

#### Lowe and Coburn to film Proximity

CLEVELAND (AP)— A film crew in Cleveland has started shooting the story of a fugitive on the run.

It isn't another rehash of the Sam Sheppard murder case which took place here and helped inspire the 1960s series *The Fugitive*. It is an HBO movie called *Proximity* starring Rob Lowe and James Coburn.

Lowe plays an inmate who is marked for death by a shadowy group led by Coburn's character. Lowe escapes, then gets chased through Cleveland.

Darren Demetre, a producer on the film, said the diversity of Cleveland's landscape with industrial areas, the Flats neighborhood along the Cuyahoga River and the skyline, made it a good place to film.

"It gives the film a very real look," he said.

Filming began Monday in suburban Cleveland Heights with a scene in which Lowe visits his family after escapes. Filming is expected to be completed in early July and the movie will probably come out next year.
