Number of children on the Internet tripled in three years

SAN MATEO, Calif. (AP) — Children are fueling the Internet explosion, according to a new national survey that found the number of 2- to 17-year-olds logging into cyberspace has tripled since 1997.

"The notion that children are an emerging market is no longer true. They have emerged," said Peter Grunwald, president of the San Mateo-based Grunwald Associates, which conducted the survey.

The survey found that more than 25 million children in the United States are on the Internet, up from 8 million in 1997.

And by the year 2005, the number of children online is expected to increase by another 70 percent, the survey projected.

Grunwald attributed the growth of kids on the Internet partly to the skyrocketing number of mothers online. The survey showed a quadrupling of moms on the Internet, from 4.5 million in 1997 to 16.4 million by the end of last year.

Children were found to be a primary reason behind household decisions to purchase a computer and gain Internet access, Grunwald said. "Parents believe the Internet is an important tool for their children's learning and development," he said.

Other survey findings included: — Almost two-thirds of all family

households have home computers and 46 percent of them are hooked onto the Internet.

— Girls are logging onto the Web as much or more often than boys are

— Schools will likely surpass homes as the primary gateway to the Internet for children by 2005.

Grunwald Associates, a market research and consulting firm, completed the survey by randomly reaching 1,735 U.S. households that included computer users and nonusers.

The online population findings by Grunwald fall roughly in line with other analyst forecasts.

Jupiter Communications of New York has projected that the number of 2- to 17-year-olds using the Internet will more than double from 21.4 million at the end of 1999 to 46.7 million by 2005.

Yates wins money from publishers

LONDON (AP) — The girlfriend of the late INXS singer Michael Hutchence won substantial damages Wednesday from the publishers of a book that said she deliberately became pregnant to trap him into a relationship.

Paula Yates also received an apology from *The Mail on Sunday* tabloid, which published excerpts from the book by Vince Lovegrove last year.

Yates, a TV personality and author, was Hutchence's partner from 1994 until his death in November 1997. Their daughter, Heavenly Hiraani Tiger Lily, was born July 22, 1996.

Yates said after the hearing she was pleased. "I think when people start to tell lies about a 3-year-old child who has lost her father, anyone would take action," she said.

Sums of the settlement with the book's British publishers, Faber & Faber, and its original Australian publishers were not disclosed.

Housekeeper of Stone incarcerated

LOS ANGELES (AP) — Sharon Stone's former housekeeper was sentenced to 16 months in prison after pleading no contest to taking pricey handbags, shoes, jewelry and other goods from the actress.

Judge Victoria Chavez also ordered Socorro "Coco" Del Carmen Membrano to pay Stone as much as \$50,000 in restitution.

Stone, who wasn't in court Tuesday for the case's disposition, has said

she was hurt by the actions of the woman she had all but considered a family member.

Membrano, 48, pleaded no contest to a single count of receiving stolen property.

Among the items reported taken were dozens of evening gowns, including one worth \$20,000.

Authorities said Stone noticed things missing over the years and would occasionally ask Membrano if she knew where they were.

"The housekeeper would say, 'Oh, I gave that to your sister,' or, 'Oh, that's at the cleaners,'" said Deputy District Attorney Wendy E. Segall.

The actress finally learned the truth authorities said, after other staffers saw the items stuffed into eight garbage bags at Membrano's home.

University honors Turner and Fonda

ST. LOUIS (AP) — A university decided to honor Ted Turner and Jane Fonda jointly for their dedication to environmental causes.

Then the celebrity couple announced their separation.

So, Turner will go solo Thursday to pick up his World Ecology Award from the University of Missouri at St. Louis.

Fonda will get her award at a separate ceremony on a yet-unspecified date.

The university presents the annual award to high-profile individuals who help raise public awareness of global ecological problems.

Turner has crusaded for cleaner cars and greener business, and the Turner Foundation provides funding for research on ecology and population issues.

Fonda is the vice president of the foundation.

Song removed from restaurant name

ADDISON, Texas (AP) — The Hotel California Grill is no more.

The suburban Dallas restaurant, now called the Baja California Grill, and all signs and references to the famous Eagles' tune must be removed under a settlement approved this week by a Dallas County judge.

The rock group sued last month claiming trademark infringement and owner Bill Arnold decided not to fight.

"I truly believe they didn't have a case, but it's time to move on and put this thing behind us," Arnold told Dallas TV station KTVT.

The group's *Hotel California* album sold 15 million copies, making it among the top sellers of all time.

As part of the settlement reached Monday, the restaurant cannot play Eagles music exclusively.
