





Man sought on bounty protected

REYNOSA, Mexico (AP) - A Mexican activist who promised \$10,000 to anyone who killed a U.S. Border Patrol agent last week has won a protective order keeping police from arresting him.

Authorities said Carlos Ibarra

Perez had been granted a Mexican legal procedure that, in effect, protects him from arrest while he's inside his home, according to The (McAllen) Monitor. The order forces Ibarra Perez to stay inside his home until all legal issues surrounding his case are resolved.

Last week, Mexican police charged him with publicly provoking the commission of a crime.
