### Man sought on bounty protected

REYNOSA, Mexico (AP) — A Mexican activist who promised \$10,000 to anyone who killed a U.S. Border Patrol agent last week has won a protective order keeping police from arresting him. Authorities said Carlos Ibarra

Perez had been granted a Mexican legal procedure that, in effect, protects him from arrest while he's inside his home, according to The (McAllen) Monitor. The order forces Ibarra Perez to stay inside his home until all legal issues surrounding his case are resolved. Last week, Mexican police charged him with publicly provoking the commission of a crime.

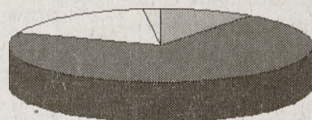
### Officers increase scrutiny, violations

DALLAS (AP) — Since early May, extra police assigned to Dallas' 50 worst intersections have written more than 7,500 citations to drivers who ran red lights. The Dallas Police Department is using \$2 million in federal funds

to pay overtime to 18 officers who work six days each week, Traffic Division Lt. John Branton told Dallas Morning News. Collisions due to red-light violations have been on the rise nationally, officials say. "Last year, almost 200 people died because of things like that," Senior Cpl. Michael Smith said. "It's getting to be a big problem."
