Ordinances in different cities and counties vary, according to Sgt. Mark Stoddard, with the Bryan Police Department.

"In the city of Bryan, burning an

open fire is a Class C misdemeanor and could result in fines up to \$1000," Stoddard said.

Bowen said the University cannot prevent students from building their own bonfire.

"What students do off campus, in their private capacities, is not within

our control. If students go off campus, or if I go off campus, and do something that my institution disagrees with, there are not things we can do [to punish them]," Bowen said. "All we would ask them is to make it very clear that they are not acting out an activity on behalf of the University."

traditions that brought us to that level," Hurst said. Mary Dickerson, Class of '94, said Bowen's decision to eliminate cut took her by surprise.

"I am not surprised that Bowen put conditions on the future of bonfire. I am surprised that they took so much of the student involvement away. I think Bowen tried to do the right thing, but I think

he did a disservice to us by taking out the student involvement," Dickerson said. "There are many ways to put rules in something. Bowen is going so far to reconstruct bonfire that it seems like he is taking it away. Bonfire the way I remember it is not the way others will remember it," she said.

Chuck Dickerson, Class of '92, said Bowen's decision to postpone bonfire for two years was disappointing.

"I was kind of disappointed that they concluded

that they needed to wait so long before having another bonfire. It is good that they are taking measures," Dickerson said.

Gratkowski said he hopes the administration will be flexible with the terms laid out in the decision.

"I am glad that they did not flat-out abolish That would have been wrong," Gratkowski said. "I hope the decision is not set in stone and that they will be flexible about it."

Bowen said students who petitioned for change should understand that the conditions laid out in his announcement are negotiable conditions for a bonfire. Rules and regulations will be developed by a task force of students, faculty and staff.

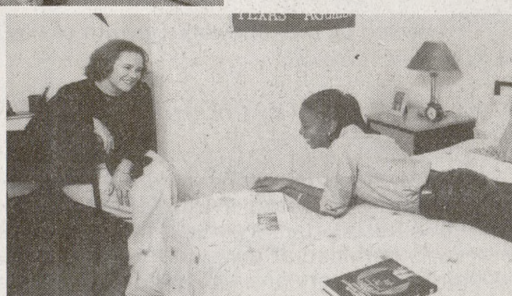

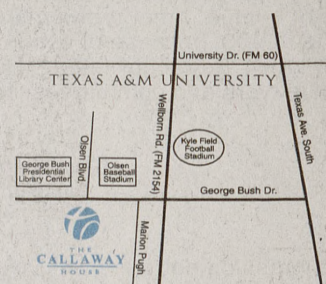
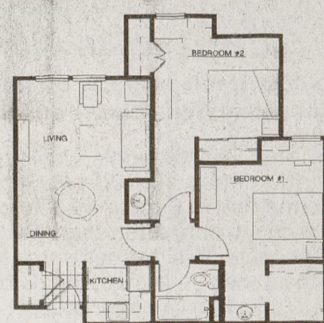
