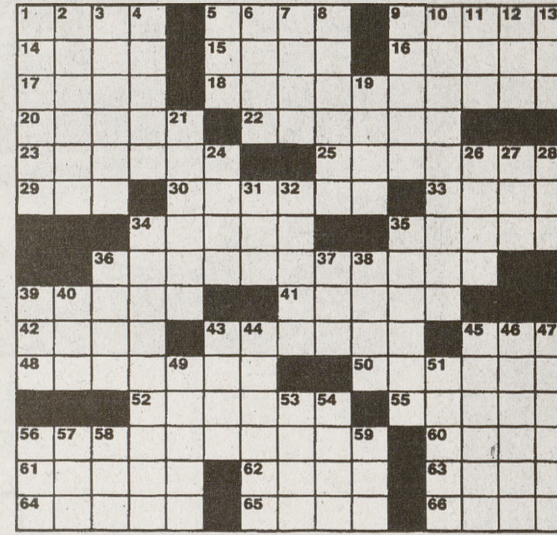

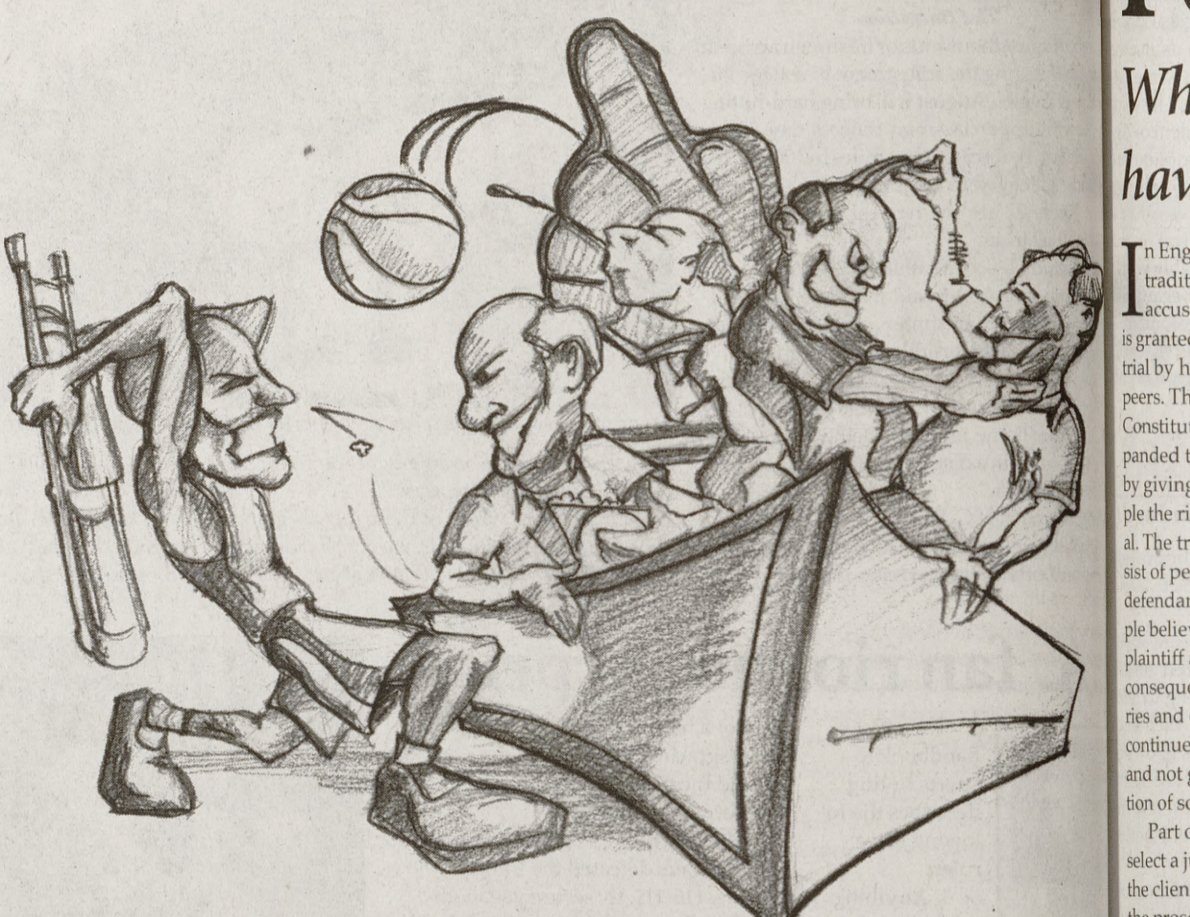

He said he is disappointed about signing only one true receiver.

Another athlete who may step in and play receiver is Eric Crutchfield out of Galena Park, Texas.

Slocum said he was disappointed with A&M's overall kicking game from last year, and wanted to bring in a few recruits to compete in the fall. Punter Cody Scates of Tyler Lee will attempt to fill Shane Lechler's All-American shoes, and Chris Sims of Garland High is the first kicker to receive a football scholarship since Kyle Bryant in 1994.

"The kicking game is such an important aspect of football," Slocum said. "I didn't want to take a chance."

Slocum said the defensive line needed to get bigger and more physical. Defensive tackle Eddie Brown stands 6'2", weighing 295 pounds, and led Eisenhower to last year's 5A State Championship game. Linnis Smith, out of John Tyler is 6'4", 260 pounds and has the ability to play both inside and out on the line. Marcus Jasmin, of De La Salle High School in New Orleans, is one of only two recruits from outside the Lone Star State. He is the biggest of the three defensive linemen at 6'4" and 295 pounds.

The other recruit from outside Texas is Joey Perot. He is a 6'4" tight end out of Petal, Mississippi. Slocum said he is thrilled to have signed Perot.

"I wish I had 15 Perots. I want sign all 15 and play them at the end, offensive line and defense," Slocum said.

Slocum also signed two high school All-American offensive linemen. Kasey Cheshier helped lead Duncanville High to the 5A State Championship as a junior. Grant Hangerarter is from New Braunfels and will be competing in the upcoming California/Texas High School All-Star game.

Slocum said he was satisfied with the current linebackers and did not sign as many as in past years. Brandon Thompson of Tyler Lee could line up at either inside or outside linebacker for the Aggies.

LeBrandon Sheppard was the 12-5A Defensive Player of the Year while playing for Lufkin High. Ricky Cardoza played both sides of the ball at Mission High, and is expected to play outside linebacker for the Aggies.

Slocum said sometimes a team can win in spite of a quarterback. The quarterback makes a big difference. He said freshman Dustin Lee has quick feet and a quick release, but college football is a big jump from Port Neches, Texas.

While playing for Port Neches, Grove, Long led the team to the 4A Division II State Championship game and was named Offensive Player of the Year by the *Houston Chronicle*.

Keith Joseph was signed as a running back out of Houston Lamar, and Mathus Gill is a wideback from Brenham.
