Waco educator arrested in shooting

HUBBARD, Texas (AP) — A former Waco middle school assistant principal has been arrested in the weekend shooting of a man at a reunion in Hubbard, 30 miles northeast of Waco.

William F. Gamble, 45, was arrested early Sunday, several hours after the shooting, at his residence in Bellmead, a few miles north of Waco. He was taken to Hill County Jail in Hillsboro, where

bond was set at \$500,000.

Gamble is accused of killing Michael Beverly of Waco during a gathering of former Hubbard residents. Hubbard Police Chief Mitch Tyra said Beverly was shot several times. He was taken to Hillcrest Baptist Medical Center in Waco, where he died.

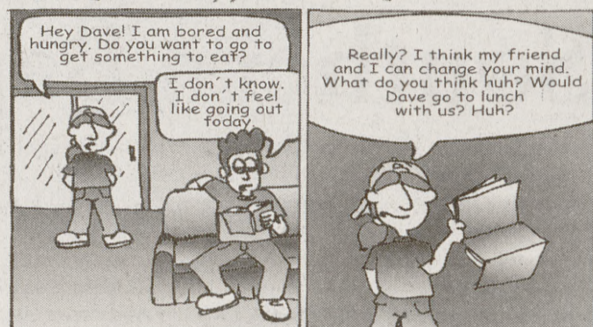
Tyra said Gamble and Beverly knew each other.

"There were a lot of people there, so we saw several eye witnesses," he said.

Gamble was an assistant principal at G.L. Ley Middle School last school year, but had signed a teaching contract for next year, said Carol Steiner, a spokeswoman for the Waco school system.

She said Gamble has been placed on administrative leave.

News in Brief

Water accidents claim Texan lives

HOUSTON (AP) — A 36-year-old Texas man died while spearfishing off Port Aransas Sunday and a 9-year-old Houston boy presumed dead off the coast of Galveston after a series of weather-related accidents off the Texas Coast this past weekend.

In Port Aransas, Anthony Steiner of Portland, Texas, died Sunday while diving off oil rigs in the Gulf of Mexico.

In Galveston, Broderick Gray was missing and presumed dead Monday after he and two other boys were swept out to sea on Sunday while playing in the water.

Kevin Moore, 12, and James White, 11, were rescued by their uncle, Robert Anders. Anders originally had three boys in tow, but Gray was swept from his arms and out to sea, officials said. Texans on Monday were greeted another week of hot, dry conditions as summer weather settled in around the state.

Activists protest dolphin exhibit

CORPUS CHRISTI, Texas (AP) — A weekend protest animal rights activists staged near the Texas State Aquarium has resulted in three arrests.

Dozens protested the proposed Dolphin Bay exhibit, a \$11.5 million project the aquarium is raising funds to construct.

Erv Strong, a dolphin rights activist and owner of a Coastal Bend business that provides boat tours for viewing dolphins in the wild, said none of the men arrested is from the area.

"I'm always concerned when something (such as Saturday's arrest) happens, because this is a legitimate cause," Strong of Dolphin Connection in Ingleside told the Corpus Christi Caller Times in Monday's edition. "Putting a dolphin in a concrete pit to swim in a circle where it dies in four to five years, is ridiculous."
