

# Actors strike advertising industry

LOS ANGELES (AP) — Actors striking against the advertising industry rallied in dozens of cities Tuesday in the biggest public display since the labor dispute began nearly three months ago.

The protests targeted corporate offices of AT&T, one of the major firms that has made nonunion commercials during the walkout by the Screen Actors Guild and the American Federation of Television and Radio Artists. They also

targeted stores selling AT&T products. AT&T has "aggressively pursued nonunion work. They still refuse to sign the interim agreement," said SAG spokesman Greg Krizman, referring to a pact that has allowed some advertisers to make union ads during the strike.

Rallies were held in cities including Los Angeles, Dallas, Honolulu, Minneapolis, Orlando and Philadelphia. The largest demonstration, in Chicago,

attracted up to 500 people, Krizman said.

In New York, about 200 protesters gathered on Wall Street to hear AFL-CIO chief John Sweeney, who lauded the "spirit and solidarity of our movement." The actors' guilds are affiliated with the AFL-CIO.

The rally included representatives of the Communications Workers of America, which is sparring with AT&T

over union attempts to organize workers in newer AT&T subsidiaries including AT&T Broadband.

A call to AT&T in New York seeking comment early Tuesday evening was not immediately returned.

The strike began May 1. In a bid to revive negotiations that stopped in April, federal mediators have scheduled informal talks with both sides July 20 in New York.

## News in Brief

### Logging protester sues 3 companies

SAN FRANCISCO (AP) — Julia "Butterfly" Hill, who lived in a tree for more than two years to protest the logging of old-growth redwoods, is going to court over a magazine ad that she says mocks her.

The ad resembles widely published photos taken as Hill lived on a platform in the 1,000-year-old redwood, according to a federal lawsuit filed last Thursday against AT&T Corp., OmniSky Corp. and advertising agency TBWA Chiat/Day.

The woman in the ad, however, is holding a small OmniSky wireless Internet device. A man at the base of the tree holds two large buckets and is looking up a rope ladder. A logo on his jacket reads sponge-bath.com.

"That she, who had endured severe physical, mental and spiritual challenges and risked her life in support of her efforts to save old growth forests, would use a wireless Internet and e-mail service to call a man to bathe her and would endorse defendants' products in a commercial advertisement was way beyond comprehension," Hill's lawyer, Ina J. Risman of San Francisco, wrote in court papers.

Hill, 26, was traveling Tuesday and was unavailable for comment.

On one front, at least, Clinton's success: Barak said Israel was considering the \$250 million sale of an advanced airborne radar system to China, as the administration and some members of Congress had sought, citing security concerns.

Israeli spokesperson Gadi Baltiansky said the decision was intended to improve prospects for summit success. Israel, he said, needed to preserve its "intimate relations with the United States.

Despite the news blackout at Camp David, outside the Maryland mountain retreat representatives from both camps were speaking freely.

Palestinian spokesperson Hanan Ashrawi said Wednesday on CNN that Israel was ignoring the plight of Palestinian refugees.

"Shirking responsibility is not a good way to start (the summit)," she said.

Israeli Cabinet minister Yuli Tamir repeated Israel's rejection of Palestinian demands to establish a capital in the traditionally Arab eastern sector of Jerusalem.

"There will be no division of sovereignty over Jerusalem," Tamir, the minister of immigration and absorption, said on CNN. "Jerusalem will never be divided."
