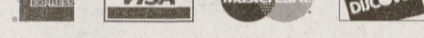

Gerald Ford suffers from two strokes

PHILADELPHIA (AP) — Former President Gerald Ford suffered one and possibly two small strokes at the Republican convention that were mistaken for a sinus infection, and was hospitalized Wednesday with slurred speech and difficulties with balance. "He should totally recover," said Dr. Robert Schwartzman, chief of neurology at Hahnemann University Hospital, where the 87-year-old former president walked in about 9 a.m. under his own power, briefcase in hand. A half day after he was admitted "I am very happy to report that President Ford is improving. He is much better," the doctor said. The former president is expected to remain hospitalized for about five days.

Microerfs Douglas Coupland ReganBooks Book courtesy of Barnes & Noble

T-shirts and chinos from Gap aside, the world of Microsoft needs might be foreign enough to make them seem like an entertaining novelty act: easy to laugh at and easier to forget. But in Microerfs, the land of Bill Gates and his plebians offers enough humor and true insight to make the subjects of production hassles and Apple envy an enjoyable read. Douglas Coupland sets the groundwork with Daniel, a tester, or "bug checker," at Microsoft, who also narrates the book. Daniel lives in a group house with five other Microsoft employees still suffering from post-graduation, and social limbo. As the roommates live life at Microsoft, and then life without Bill once they move to Silicon Valley, they voice how they became misfits and how they plan to get lives in the early 1990s. Coupland lets readers explore love, relationships and success against the backdrop of a quickly expanding electronic lifestyle. Social commentary aside, the book is just strange enough to be fun. Readers get more than just a glimpse into the eccentric world of nerds through "subconscious computer files" and strange character introductions. For example, Abe, one of Daniel's roommates, is given these as his all-time best "Jeopardy!" categories: Intel assembly language, bulk shopping, C++, introversion, "I love my aquarium," how to have a million dollars and not let it affect your life in any way, and clean laundry.

So, the book is quirky. However, bet it is that if readers know what C++ is or secretly consider how cool it would be to reprogram video games to make them easier to win, the book will allow them to experience enough harmless geekiness to get their teeth fixed without losing all sense of positive self-esteem.
