PHILADELPHIA (AP) - Forme President Gerald Ford suffered on and possibly two small strokes at the Republican convention that werem taken for a sinus infection, and wa hospitalized Wednesday with slure speech and difficulties with balance

"He should totally recover said Dr. Robert Schwartzman, chie of neurology at Hahneman University Hospital, where the 87 year-old former president walked in about 9 a.m. under his own power, briefcase in hand.

A half day after he was admitted "I am very happy to report that President Ford is improving. He i much better," the doctor said. The former president is expected to remain hospitalized for about five days.

Dr. Carole Thomas, another of the physicians treating Ford, said the former president "continues to have mild problems" with walking and slurred speech. He was being treated with anti-clotting medication.

Ford, America's 38th president, had gone to the hospital overnight complaining of pain during a GOP salute to him and other former GOP presidents during the convention Tuesday. He was sent home after about a half-hour with antibiotics and a diagnosis of a sinus infection.

Douglas Coupland sets the groundwork with Daniel, a tester, or "bug checker," at Microsoft, who also narrates the book. Daniel lives in a group house with five other Microsoft employees still suffering from post-graduation, and social, limbo. As the roommates live life at Microsoft, and then life without Bill once they move to Silicon Valley, they voice how they became misfits and how they plan to get lives in the early 1990s. Coupland lets readers explore love, relationships and suc cess against the backdrop of a quick ly expanding electronic lifestyle.

Social commentary aside, the book is just strange enough to be fun Readers get more than just a glimpse into the eccentric world of nerds through "subconscious computer files" and strange character introduc tions. For example, Abe, one of Daniel's roommates, is given these as his all-time best "Jeopardy!" cate gories: Intel assembly language, bulk shopping, C++, introversion, "I love my aquarium," how to have a million dollars and not let it affect your lifein

any way, and unclean laundry. So, the book is quirky. However, bets are that if readers know what C++ is or secretly consider how coolit would be to reprogram video game to make them easier to win, the book will allow them to experience enough harmless geekiness to get their ted fix without losing all sense of pos tive self-esteem. (Grade: B+)
