

## Shark attack kills Florida man freshman, and I freshman elective riding a r

Wife witnesses husband struggling with animal

A man swimming in shallow water in the Intracoastal Waterway was killed in a shark attack witnessed by his wife.

Thadeus Kubinski, 69, was dead by the time emergency workers arrived Wednesday afternoon following the rare shark sighting in the waterway, said St. Pete Beach Fire Chief Fred Golliner.

Kubinski's son Edward said his mother, Anna, told him the couple went swimming in 5 feet of water about 10 feet off his dock in Boca

Mrs. Kubinski, who was too distressed to speak with the media, out of the water to seek help.
