Park to be decorated with lights for victims

To commemorate the lives of the 12 Aggies who died in the 1999 Bonfire collapse, the city of College Station will decorate Bison Park with 12 dedicated street lights and a state marker.

Each street light will have a miniature plaque with the deceased Aggie's name, class, hometown and there will be a picture of a bonfire above the name.

"We want something permanent in memory of these students," said Margaret Griffith, co-chair of the College Station historic preservation committee and health education coordinator at A.P. Beutel Health Center.

David Gerling, special facilities superintendent and emergency shelter coordinator for the city of College Station and the state markers will cost between \$ 900 and 1,100 and the cost of the plaques has not yet been estimated.

The state marker will have a statement about how the tragedy affected the College Station community, along with a list of the Aggies who died.

At the top of the plaque, there will be a picture of a train station and at the bottom, after the text, will be a picture of a bonfire.

The committee agreed unanimously to cast it in aluminum rather than bronze. They are being produced by OMC Industries.

Deborah Jasek, former chairwoman of the College Station historic preservation committee, said the city plans to hold a dedication ceremony. The date has not yet been set because the committee is waiting to make sure there are no conflicts with Texas A&M's plans for memorials and other services.

The College Station Historic Preservation Committee also discussed possible action on a Neighborhood Recognition Program. Residents in the historic area of College Station who remodel, re-landscape or improve their home may be recognized by the city. Nominations are made by neighbors or others in the community, Jasek said.

The idea behind this is to recognize people who restore or enhance the historic area, Jasek said. The details of the program have not been finalized.

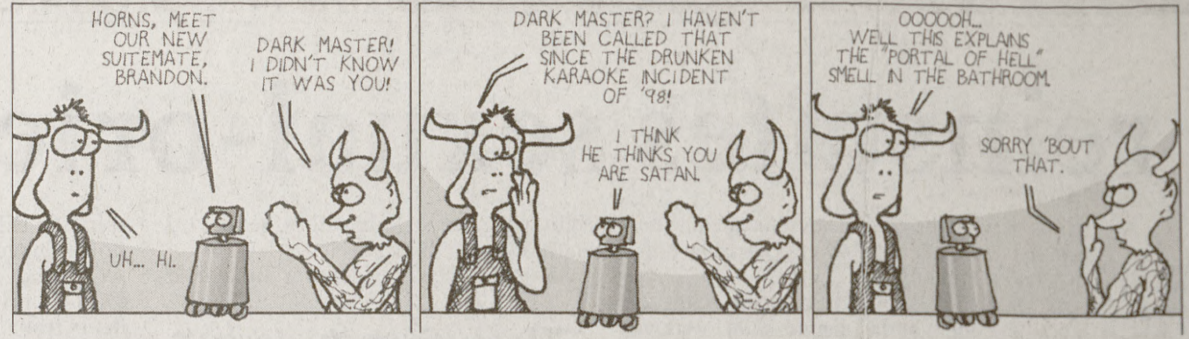
The committee discussed a potential book and film on the history of the Bryan-College Station area which would begin once adequate funding is received. The city would need to donate \$50,000 along with the city of Bryan, Brazos county and non-profit donors and private donors.

Julie Schultz, a member of the heritage board, presented the book and film to the committee and said other will oversee the film production.

This project will begin once adequate funding is received, Schultz said.

The committee said it will need more time to decide on this issue.

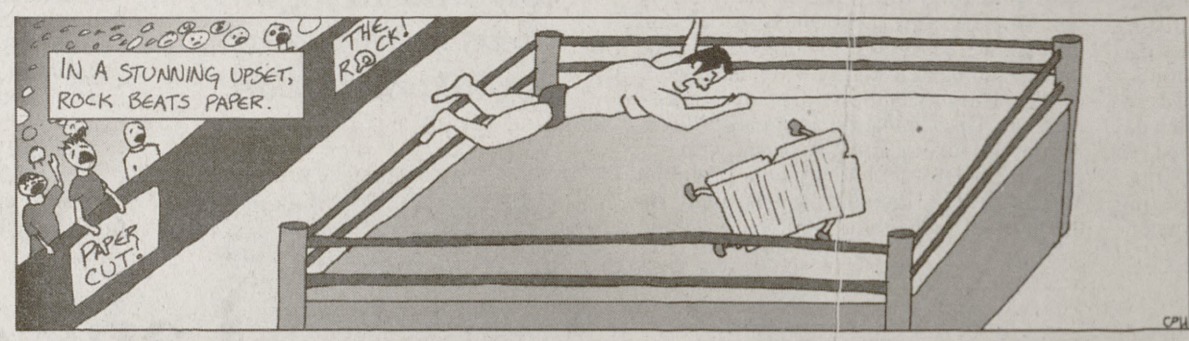

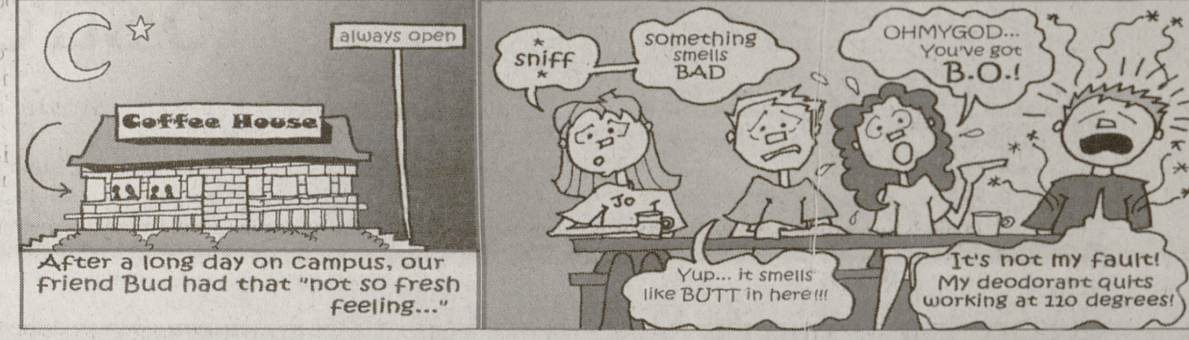

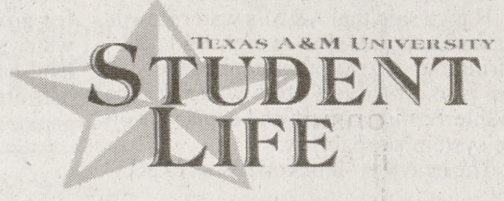
