News in Brief

Woman found dead in apartment

College Station police have made progress in the investigation of the death of Dorisela Roman, a 17-year-old College Station resident. Autopsy results determined that Roman, who was found dead in her apartment Wednesday morning, died of a single gunshot wound.

Police said that the manager of Viking Apartments, where Roman lived, went to check on Roman after being called by concerned family members.

Roman's 3-year-old son was found in the apartment unharmed. The child was admitted to the College Station Medical Center for observation and will be turned over to child protective services when he is released.

Boot line tradition to continue Sat.

The "boot line" tradition at home football games will continue at the Wyoming game Saturday. The Class of 2001 will go onto the track at halftime for a yell practice. Afterward, the seniors will line up outside the team entrance, and the football players will enter through the line for the second half.

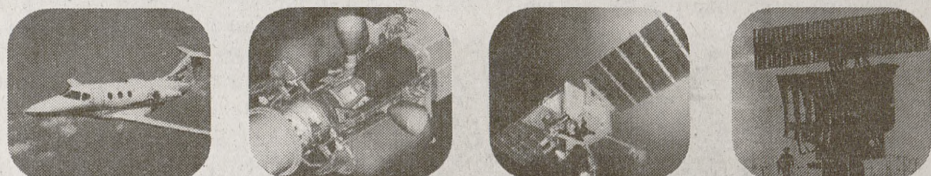
